included the following:

By Laws: Revisions are being prepared and hopefully presented to the membership for action in the next few months. Nothing major - increased time for national elections, abolish annual membership meeting, officially establish Zone Coordinators. A definition of a Porsche for determination of eligibility for PCA membership will be added. This is primarily to further pronounce National PCA policy that 914 camers are eligible for membership.

Regional Boundaries: CIR is one of many regions being asked to extend its boundaries. We have been asked to add several counties in the sounthern

part of the atate.

1972 Parade: This Parade will not be in Atlanta or in the Arlanta area as previously planned. A new location is being sought.

BRAILLE RALLY

May 3, 1970 is the date for the 10th Annual Inter-Club Braille Rally. The 80-car event will team drivers of sports and compact cars with students from the Indiana School for the Blind who will navigate with Braille instructions. As always, the annual event is eagerly awaited by drivers and navigators alike.

No calculations are used in the Braille Rally so you need not be an experienced rallyist to participate. We are looking for safe, responsible drivers who will enjoy an afternoon of dependent teamwork with their navigators and pleasant competition with other participants.

The rally will start at the Indiana School of the Blind, 7725 North College Avenue, Indianapolis. Registration and safety inspection will begin at 12 noon. Seat belts are mandatory and other safety equipment, such as

horn, turn signals, brakes, etc., will be checked.

As a driver you will escort your navigator to a victory dinner following the rally, then return the navigator to the School. You will not pay for your navigator's dinner but must pay \$2.50 for your own meal and for that of anyone else you might ask to attend the dinner. There is no entry fee for the rally.
