REPORT ON NOR'EAST '70

Question asked at the 15th Porsche Parade: "What's with this Central Indiana Region - don't they admit married people?" To disprove the theory, Mike and Sharon Cooper popped in for one day. At the first event of the Parade the Concours, many people marveled at the appearance of John Carmack's yellow 356B Roadster. John captured third place in class and if memory serves correctly, fourteenth overall. Next day, John and Georgeanna placed second in the Unequipped class and twelfth overall in the rally. Mike and driver Roger Chaney from Texas, in Mike's Speedster, took second in Equipped class and second overall. The autocross was run on two days in order to give everyone two timed runs.
