### MARCH EVENT

On a windy, rain-threatening afternoon, the Gymkhana at Lilly's parking lot was well attended, if not heavy on participants. Most of the crowd classified as spectators, due to various reasons, (for one, the course wasn't set up to accommodate Toronados) some cars notably absent were still "down" due to pre-race season preparations and others were merely too shy, or reluctant to stress their pet Porsches. However, thirteen lucky(?) drivers did run Kunack's challenging course and seemed to have a lot of fun in the process. Each run consisted of three circuits of the course and the watch was started as the cars crossed the start line on their second trip past.

The only driver to get down under 1 minute was Erwin Dollinger, with .58.7 in his red 9115. The second fastest time was set by James Schneider in his new metalic gold 911T, with 1:04.6. Mike Robbins' Speedster kept kicking over that one final pylon but his run of 1:05.3 was good for third place. Sharon Cooper, who won the Ladies' first place trophy, had to come back and pick up a navigator to help her find the proper route through the pylons. Once she got the hang of it she really threw her white 912 through the course in 1:10.4. Second place for Ladies' went to Angela Matthews, guest entrant, driving in her first gymkhana. She did

a neat 1:11.6 in Tom Farmam's yellow 914.

The first place trophies were engraved silver salad fork and spoon sets, silver cordial cups were second and third place awards. Donuts and soft drinks were served and we want to thank Ann and Werner for their efforts to provide us with a good event.

A sentimental reunion took place that afternoon when Mrs. Alton (Olive) Dice, of Peru, Indiana, made this an occasion to visit with her PCA friends. This was the first time that she has attended a PCA event since the death of her husband last year and it was a happy—sad experience for all. She and Mr. Dice are obviously well loved and remembered and we hope she continues to visit us often.

I didn't have my editor's hat on at this event so I forgot to note the names of all who attended, but Dr. Jean Spear, Fort Wayne, did introduce himself and his daughter to me and it was a pleasure to meet them and encouraging to note that they were attending an event so far from home.

# 11thANNUAL INTER-CLUB BRAILLE RAILY - MAY 2,1971

May 2,1971 is the date for the 11th Annual Inter-Club Braille Rally. The 80-car event will team drivers of sports and compact cars with students from the Indiana School for the Blind who will navigate with Braille instructions. As always, the annual event is eagerly awaited by drivers and navigators alike.

No calculations are used in the Braille Rally so you need not be an experienced rallyist to participate. We are looking for safe, responsible drivers who will enjoy an afternoon of dependent teamwork with their navigators and pleasant competition with other participants.

The rally will start at the Indiana School for the Blind,7725 North College Avenue, Indianapolis. Registration and safety inspection will begin at 12 noon. Seat belts are mandatory and other safety equipment such as horn, turn signals, brakes, etc., will be checked.

As a driver you will escort your navigator to a victory dinner following the rally, then return the navigator to the school. You will not pay for your navigator's dinner but must pay \$4.50 for your own meal and for that of anyone else you might ask to attend the dinner. There is no entry fee for the rally. Please make your dinner check or money order payable to billy Motor Club and send it with your entry form. Do not send cash.
