The June event was hosted by Gene & Joan Dodd and varied only slightly from the May event. Here, again, we also ate, drank and "played cars". Eleven cars were entered in the Concours and the following winners were determined: Class #1-Most Elegant-Ben & Pauline Bowen's Gold 911S. Class #2: Most Venerable- Gene & Judy Covert's blue Speedster, which was nearly tied with Mike Robbins' Speedster, which won Class #3: Popular Choice. The trophies were miniature silver wine coolers (cigarette urns) suitably engraved. BOARD MEETING:

The PCA-CIR Board met at Mike Robbins' on June 24 and determined several issues that required their attention. Topics considered included the invitation to participate in a jointly sponsored annual autocross with three neighboring regions. The Board voted to decline since we have a minimum response to our competitive events, even when members don't have far to travel, and we couldn't offer these other regions much participation.

A report on the April IRP Autocross determined that, even though it was not a large financial success, it would be desirable to consider a replay for '72, since we would have more time to develop participation and have much organizational experience behind us. April was judged to be the best month for the '72 event.

CIR was approached to attend an Autocross at Nelson Ledges in August but due to distance and timing the Board reasoned that we could not expect to send members 600 miles to an autocross.

Discussion of the attempts to organize a joint attendance of the region to see "Le Mans" resulted in the decision to drop the idea. We would have to guarantee 40 tickets to get a group price and other regions were getting better deals from the theaters. Local management was not co-operative with Mike Cooper and Mike Robbins, who spent much effort trying to set a time, place and ticket deal.

A letter was read asking for nominations for Zone Representative, and after hearing all the necessary qualifications required, it was decided that Mike Robbins was the most qualified to be re-nominated for the job. Georgeanna Tutrow volunteered to prepare the nomination.

A discussion of financing arrangements for future events, based on past experiences, led the Board to determine that no action need be taken but that Event Chairman and Treasurer work closely with event hosts to insure reasonable budgets and no financial inconvenience to members planning or hosting events. (If you are planning to host an event, get with Mike Cooper and/or Jim Sandifer for information concerning financial arrangements concerning trophies, refreshments, etc...)

This concluded the business of the meeting and, because the beer ran out and Mike's air conditioner was defunct, everyone left soon after.
