HINTS FROM HELOISE

One area of the car that every 914 owner should keep clean every 6000 miles is the nylon pulley over which the clutch cable pivots. Dirt cakes around the pulley and it's a fifteen minute job to remove the pulley and clean it -- but if this area is not kept clean, the pulley will not rotate and the cable will rub into the nylon. You'll hear a squeak in the cable if you have this problem. The cable will probably last only 2000 miles or so when the pulley is not free to turn.

The Author's style runs toward the melodramatic -- particularly in his descriptions of races. Porsche's small displacement class wins in several years of endurance racing is played down -- as if they were disappointed at not winning overall. An error regarding John Wolfe's death in practice at LeMans is later corrected -- a first lap accident. In leafing thru later sections of the book I see that technical development of the car is covered. I'll be anxious to see how complete and factual it is. Little is said about Mr. Pihera's credentials but from what I've seen so far, he lacks qualifications to handle the subject accurately and interestingly.

Despite these negative comments I'm sure all Porscheniks will want this book -- just because its about Porsches.

911 Models with Weber Carburetors

Does your engine miss between 3000-4000 RPM ? The problem is often clogged or dirty idle-metering jets. * Remove them and blow them out with compressed air untill clean, and then replace.

* (There is one idle-metering jet for each carb. throat or six in total. They are made of Brass with a common screwdriver slot. They are located just below the top carburetor gasket joint at the upper outboard side of the two 5-throat carburetors.)
