

Next summer is going to be a repeat...with a small twist. Next summer's activities will be Porsche related.



Winery Tour and Kentucky Octoberfest

Saturday, October 24

The fourth annual trip to the Huber Winery, near Salem, Indiana, will once again be tied into the Kentucky Region Octoberfest. We have been invited to join our southern friends after our winery visit for dinner, a people's choice concours, and door prizes as an optional way to spend our tour.

At the winery, we can sample wines or have cider and soft drinks. Snacks and sandwiches are also available as is the purchase of bottle wine. In the nearby building there is an open market for fruits, vegetables, preserves, in addition to the craft shop in the main building.

We will leave Indy traveling separately or in convoy to the winery, and conclude our tour there or optionally continue to the Octoberfest site in the Louisville area about a 45 minute drive away. Be prepared for a German style outdoor picnic with Bratwurst, beer, etc., etc., etc. The schedule below is in Indianapolis time.

Convoy start: 9 a.m. sharp! Registration opens at 8:30 a.m. at the Kentucky Fried Chicken parking lot next to the Signature Inn, I65 and exit 103 (Southport Rd.) south of Indy. Complete route instructions will be given out there or mailed to you if you want to make your own way to the winery. A stamped, self addressed envelope should accompany your entry for the instructions.

Winery visit: Plan to arrive at 12:30 p.m.

Octoberfest: Depart winery at 2:30 p.m. for arrival at the meeting site before 3:30 p.m.

CIR co-hosts 356 classic show and swap

In a prelude to Porsche's Indianapolis activities next year, CIR will be hosting the 356 Registry event at the Speedway this October 16-18. The event will feature a number of automotive and social activities.

More than 200 Porsches (over one hundred 356 models) are anticipated, with an anticipated total attendance of 400-plus Porsche enthusiasts.

And why not? Not only will there be a concours to show off each Porsche in the wooded 4th turn infield of the Speedway Track and a rally and a Porsche-only swap meet, but there will also be the opportunity for owners to pilot their own Porsche around the famous brickyard where drivers such as Ray Harroun, Wilbur Shaw, Jim Clark, Bobby and Al Unser, and A.J. Foyt have all gained fame and notoriety.

The festivities begin Friday night with a German Oktoberfest, featuring a German band and cuisine. Concurrent with the Oktoberfest will be a scale model and literature swap meet. A goodie store (logically stocked with Porsche goodies) and hospitality room will be open for those otherwise unoccupied.

Saturday will dawn to the sound of toothbrushes on trim and wash cloths on wheels as preparations are made for what will be the largest people's choice Porsche concours to date. The competition will be held on the Speedway grounds with attendance limited to those registered for the event. A catered lunch will be served and the early afternoon will be spent drooling over (or removing drool marks from) the finest examples of German engineering in the world.

Capping off the afternoon will be an opportunity few will want to miss. All Porsche owners will be allowed two laps on the famed 2-1/2 mile oval. Please note that proof of ownership will be required due to insurance regulations.


Those in attendance without Porsches will no doubt vie for those cramped little back seats at a rate never seen before in the free world. The evening will wind down with a 50's era (50's dress optional) awards banquet featuring a very special guest speaker.

Sunday starts with hawkers trying to unload boxes of their precious sow's ears (and greasy ones at that) at the Porsche-only swap meet. No doubt a fair number of parts will change hands and maybe a car or two.

Those wanting some true entertainment will then partake in a combined fall foliage tour and fun rally. The rally will test the Porsche trivia fans in the group along with would be olympians. It is not your normal type of rally, with minimal navigational skills required and no times stages. Just fun!

With a wave and final Auf Wiedersehen, all will be quiet until May, when once again Porsche will take to the track, this time exceeding the daring 50 mph recorded by the brave Porsche owners who will have paved the way in October of 1987!






