

# MINUTES

The January meeting of the Board of Directors was conducted January 11 at the MCL Cafeteria in Castleton. Those attending included; Steve Jenkins, Mark Haab, Brett Johnson, Jack Hollingsworth, John Carmack, Bob Axsiom, Chuck Langsenkamp and late arrival by Mark Thompson.

Thanks to Chuck who started taking minutes, and noting that Mark Haab recommended the reinstatement of the "Buddy System" for all Board members. Each Board member will be responsible for contacting new members within their assigned zip codes, welcoming them to the region and inviting them to an event. Mark Haab is responsible for Indy East, Bob Axsiom for Indy West, Steve Jenkins for Indy North, Mark Thompson for Indy South, Jack Hollingsworth for Hamilton County. Wayne Johanning is our northern region coordinator and is responsible for maintaining contact with those members. We are still looking for a member to coordinate contacts with the southern portion of the region. Any member interested in this position should contact Mark Haab.

The upcoming Parade became the next topic of discussion. Chuck Langsenkamp asked after participants receive their acceptance, they should contact Chuck so coordinated plans could be made.

Bylaws update was brought up. Bob Axsiom will provide a changes update at the next Board meeting after Board members have reviewed the current bylaws and given Bob their recommended changes. At the subsequent meeting, we will submit and discuss our proposed changes, publish them and then submit them to a membership vote.

The next item for review centered around event fees. Discussion included: whether event chairperson should be required to pay to participate in their own events, and if so, how much they should pay; whether Board members should be able to attend all events at cost; to provide 500 event workers with free T-shirts, and recommend that they be worn during the event for identification and visibility; and that the CIRcular editor be allowed to attend all events where that person is working for the CIRcular free of charge (except for

dinner costs). If you have any comments regarding these suggestions, please contact any Board member.

The Zone meeting will be conducted in Fort Wayne Saturday and Sunday, February 25-26. Those persons required to attend include the President and the newsletter Editor. Since this is a two-day event is was recommended and approved that the Region pick-up the room cost for those persons required to attend.

Under Membership, discussion centered mostly on the proposed membership directory. Privacy and security were the primary concerns. Brett assured everyone that the directory is for members only, it would not list cars owned, and the list would not be sold to anyone for any reason. Our membership list can be used for direct mail solicitation only if the vendor is willing to pay for the use of the list, provides us with the material to be mailed, including envelopes, etc., pre-stuffed and including postage. We would label them ourselves so the names are never given to any outside vendor or source. Also, any such venture would require Board approval. Brett was given the go-ahead to continue pursuing the directory.

Jack started talking about activities next. He noted that the Giganti event was all set, as was Gisela's and the March 18 Tech Session. The February 25 Tech Session is now the Zone Meeting in Fort Wayne. A chairperson for a driving event is still needed. The Winery Tour is set for October 14 and a chairperson is still needed for the Dreistaatenfest. Mark Thompson, the King of Double Bogeys, agreed to chair the First Annual CIR Golf Outing and is looking for course suggestions and a co-chairperson or two who can help come up with some witty, off the wall handicaps and stuff. The Annual Dinner is set for November 4.

The next Board Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 8, 7 p.m. at the Castleton Dooley O'Tooles (by Cub Foods). We may also celebrate a certain Board member's 29th birthday, but don't tell him...its a surprise.

Remarks It has only been a

month since my 911 was tucked away for the winter and already I miss it. As I write this, the weather is a mild 40 degrees and should stay that way all week.
