

Consistency

Consistency is stressed by race drivers and team owners alike as being one of the most important elements of a winning season. Consistency is an equally important part of our driver education program (track event), although in a slightly different context. Rather than looking for consistently high finishes throughout a

racing season, we encourage participants to develop consistency in the laps that they drive (measured subjectively, since lap timing is verboten!).

Another aspect of consistency is using the same measure of the vehicle's performance envelope in each corner.

Sound easy? Think about it for a minute. In my experience, most students have a different comfort level in each corner. As a general rule, the greater the elevation change in the corner, the lower the comfort level. As a result, less of the performance envelope is used on "vertical corners". As an example, students will often use 90% of their Porsche's performance envelope in Turn 3 at Mosport (a flat progressive sweeping right-hander) and on the following left hander with a sharp vertical drop, use only 75%. All of our instructors encourage students to drive within their limits, but we are more likely to encourage students to explore the vehicle's abilities in corners where there is more potential to work with. Ideally, a student should use the same measure of the performance envelope in each corner, and gradually explore the remaining latitudes in a progressive and consistent manner.

How do you accomplish this? I was hoping you would ask. If you are in the green run group (beginner's group), you probably have your hands full learning the track, remembering braking points, getting your down-shifts out of the way before turning in and clipping the apexes. If you have progressed to the point where

your laps are consistent (I can't help myself), you are probably in the yellow or blue run group. Ask your instructor for feedback on how much of the vehicle's performance envelope you

are using in each corner. Your instructor will be able to identify one or two corners where there is more room left.

Choose one corner each run group and concentrate on driving that corner as well as you possibly can. If you have been signed off, ask an instructor to ride with you and give you feedback, they are always happy to help.

New 911 Carrera 4 makes Guinness Book of Records

RENO, NEVADA, June 23, 1995 -- here's the PCNA version of the Porsche Cars Australia press release --

The 1995 Porsche 911 Carrera 4 was recently entered into the Guinness Book of Records as the winner of "the toughest 100,000 km test run of a sports car."

The Carrera 4 won the honor as the result of its performance in five tests: a 24-hour Arctic test at minus 35 degrees C on the ice of the frozen Mackenzie River north of the polar circle in Canada; a 24-hour run on the famed Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah; driving over 24 Alpine passes in 24 hours; 2,000 km at full speed on the race circuit in Southern Italian Nardo, reaching an average speed of 251.6 km/hour, including pit stops, a world record for fourwheel production cars; and a 24-hour test under extreme conditions on the Porsche test track at Weissach, Germany. A single kilometer on this course corresponds to stresses normally incurred in 27 km of ordinary traffic.

Introduced to North America in the fall of 1994, the 1995 Porsche 911 Carrera 4 is the all-wheel-drive version of the highly popular 1995 911 Carrera. It combines the agility and driving pleasure of the new Carrera with the advantages of an all-wheel drive system to provide maximum possible traction on all road surfaces.

The lure of single-seater competition, however, took him to California, where he served as crew chief for Michael Andretti in Formula Atlantic.

After winning the championship, Andretti and Stewart moved into Indy cars with Kraco Racing. After two years with Kraco, Stewart served as chief mechanic for Daly, Boesel and Simon in 1986.

Following his career as crew chief for racing teams, Stewart worked for two Indianapolis businesses repairing fine European vehicles.

Stewart opened his own business to offer the personal attention many fine car owners demand.

"I offer direct communication between car owner and technicians, so that vehicles can be maintained in the best condition for maximum enjoyment," he said.

In addition to working closely with car owners at his Andrade Park business, Stewart will make house calls and work on vehicles at an owner's home. He also offers prepurchase inspections and race car preparation.

Stewart works on the cars himself with the help of a parttime assistant mechanic. His wife, Deborah, performs all the bookkeeping tasks.

Although Stewart does not personally own any classic cars, he admits, "the next best thing is to work on them."




Spectators welcome at the Hoosier Porsche Classic.







You can practice RPM matching and "heel—toe" on the street while approaching a stop sign. Depending on your physical ability and your car's pedal placement, here are two techniques. One technique places the toe section of your right foot on the brake while your feel is on the gas pedal. This requires talent, practice, and you must be a bit of a contortionist. The other technique applies the left side of your right foot on the brake using a slight rolling motion with the right side of your foot on the accelerator. Practice these techniques while braking and downshifting to see if you can downshift without feeling the usual "surge," with matching RPMs. If you do this correctly your passenger will hear the RPM change but not feel the gear change. Once you master this on the street, you are ready to try it at the track, only in a straight line until you are consistent. (Called trailbraking.) Lap time will come down.

Left foot braking is just what it implies. Using your left foot on the brake while your right foot is still on the throttle. This technique is used where slight braking is required with no downshifting. By keeping a slight amount of throttle applied with your right foot while braking with your left, you will settle the chassis, load the tires more evenly and carry potentially higher speed through a corner. Again, left foot braking can be practiced on the street.

If you are at the Putnam Park PCA Race, look for the Tweeks/ Farmer Automotive #99 911 and say "Hi!" — See you there.

In case you were wondering, the new 911 goes just as fast if you lease it.

That is the question'

Downshifting, braking, and turning simultaneously smoothly is an art and may be the most difficult driving technique to master. Downshifting while entering a corner will upset the balance of your car as will braking while entering a corner, and the two together if done improperly can, and usually will, spin you quickly. To do this smoothly, the engine RPMs must "match" the rear tire revolutions when engaged to the lower gear to allow the rear tires to continue rolling at the same speed. Sound confusing? To do this, you must learn to "heel-tow" (using your right foot for both the brake and accelerator pedals simultaneously). This enables you to brake while "matching" the engine RPMs with the throttle, to the RPM needed in the next lower gear so downshifting doesn't shock your rear tires. The degree of smoothness will directly impact the balance of your car and the maximum cornering force. If the clutch is released in the middle of the corner while downshifting from 4th to 3rd gear, your rear tires will momentarily lock up if the engine RPM is not close enough to that needed to equal rear time rolling speed. If you "heel-toe" correctly, you will increase the RPM to match the gear change and not feel the gear reduction. The result is more actual cornering speed.




