

2007 Arthritis Foundation Classic Auto Show Silver Anniversary Celebration

The Central Ohio Chapter of the Arthritis Foundation invites Porsche drivers to join them for their spectacular Silver Anniversary celebration on Friday and Saturday, July 6 & 7, 2007.

The 25th Annual Classic Auto Show & Cruise-In will feature several unique displays which honor the milestone Silver Anniversary. This is central Ohio's premier car-related event — attracting more than two thousand display vehicles each year. This unique Dublin setting is perfect for a car show — with Porsche having Saturday's prime parking area in the grass, under the trees by the pond. The Arthritis Foundation Show is being promoted as a multi-region Porsche Club of America event and thus we hope to have numerous entries from surrounding Regions.

The calebration kicks off on Friday, July 6th with a Cruise-In, which has become the largest event of its kind in Ohio. More than 2,000 street rods, muscle cars, vintage cars, European exotics and other cruisers from the 1920s to the present will make their appearance. 25-years of tradition will continue with a presentation of awesome 6-foot-high trophies to the Top Cruise-In cars. In honor of the show's Silver Anniversary, 125 of these trophies will be presented to the best of the best. A huge variety of terrific food will be available at the concession stands, so plan to come early and spend the entire day with your family and friends, enjoying a live concert featuring Elvis impersonator Mike Albert in the evening!

On Saturday, July 7th, you'll have a full day at the exciting Classic Auto, with more than 40 judged classes of automobiles on display, special Show-Within-A-Show groups and several regional events taking place. Enjoy a special celebration that honors the 40th Anniversary of the Chevrolet Camaro, the Pontiac Firebird/Trans Am, and the Mercury Cougar where all of the best and rarest examples of these cars will be showcased. Many fabulous Indy Pace Car examples will be displayed, including rarely seen cars from the Bob McDorman collection. A special display of automobiles, which are more than 25 years old and owned by their original owners, will be another unique attraction. If you have an automobile that fits in this category, please contact us so that we can arrange for you to participate in this unusual event.

On Saturday the gates open at 7:30 a.m., a participants' meeting is at 11:30, with judging beginning at noon. Judging rules will be the same as in the past few years. We will have a total of 6 classes (determined by pre-registered entries to equalize competition). Keeping this the 'user-friendly' event it has been; engine compartments, undercarriages, and wheel wells will not be judged. Originality is also not considered in the scoring. If you wash your car and vacuum the interior, you're ready to enter!

The Parade of Champions starts at 4:30 p.m. The Best of Show Porsche will drive in front of the show stage to receive its award while the Class Winner and the two Award of Excellence winners for each class are announced and invited to walk up to receive their awards.

CIR/PCA Spring Color Tour Sunday, April 15

Morristown, IN to Cincinnati, Ohio

This year's Spring Color Tour falls on April 15, Tax Day! Actually, Tax Day has been extended this year until Tuesday, April 17, so you have no reason not to join us on this very popular event which traditionally opens the moving car season of our calendar each year. The tour starts in Morristown, IN, after an optional lunch at the famous 84 year old Kopper Kettle Inn in Morristown, where you can try their famous pan fried chicken. Only problem is they do not open until 11:30 AM and you have to hurry to make the Driver's Meeting at 12:30! In a hurry? Go across the street from our start point, the US Post Office in Morristown, to the Blue Bird Cafe for a quick bite.

Registration opens at noon at the Morristown Post Office rear parking lot (town center on right). Morristown is 19 mi. (1/2 hr.) southeast of I-465 and Indy on US 52 East. Driver's meeting is at 12:30 with the 3+ hr. road tour starting at 1 PM.

The tour heads east on US 52 to Rushville and continues east to Connersville on Ind. 44. At Connersville, the tour turns south on winding and hilly Ind. 121 and follows the historic Whitewater Valley Railroad and River to Metamora. Near Metamora starts the second challenge section, Ind. 229, which traverses a kind of devil's backbone through several tiny hill towns, a very European hill country-type passage. At the end of this section, a surprise occurs when you come over a ridge and descend down into Oldenburg, a very old German community ("Village of Spires") with unique architecture for Indiana and even German street names!

Crossing I-74, we enter another German heritage, but modern town, picturesque Batesville. Continuing south on Ind. 229 and others, we pass by Milan, premise for the movie "Hoosiers", and eventually connect up with the most exciting road of the tour, Ind. 262. Claimed by "Car & Driver" magazine as one of the 10 best sports car roads in the U.S., this very challenging road follows a creek down to the Ohio River and dumps out into Rising Sun, site of the new Grand Victoria Casino. This road is so good the Corvette engineers use it to test out the new Corvette models on their way back to Detroit from the Bowling Green, Kentucky plant! ! Only trouble is they go uphill and we go downhill (Porsches have better brakes!)

In Rising Sun we turn east and follow the Ohio River thru Aurora to Lawrenceburg, where the world's largest floating Argosy Riverboat Casino resides. In Aurora we also stop by the famous Hillforest Mansion with its delightful riverboat architecture.

Turning south at Lawrenceburg, we cross the mighty Ohio River on a dramatic bridge and traverse across northern Kentucky on I-275, coming into Cincinnati from the south for a spectacular view of the city's new riverfront skyline. A quick tour of a historic and very picturesque neighborhood of Covington, Kentucky's riverfront mansions (If we are lucky, the pear and cherry trees will all be in bloom), before crossing the Ohio River on the history-making John Roebling Suspension Bridge (He built it before his famous Brooklyn Bridge in New York City!).

We then head east through the downtown Cincinnati riverfront to our final destination: the famous Montgomery Inn at the Boathouse restaurant! Well known for their tasty barbecue ribs and chicken, this 3 story restaurant provides breathtaking views of the Ohio River and its many activities. Bill Cosby said he liked their ribs so well, "I even ate the bones!"



Our reservations are at 5:30 PM, so try to arrive by 5:00. Have a drink in their upstairs bar while everyone arrives. Last year it was so nice some of us even sat out on their balcony and watched the boats go by! We will be seated in the Bob Hope Room with window views.

By 7 PM or so we should be on our way back to Indy via all Interstate highways and I-465 is only 1 & 1/2 hrs. (90 mi.) away! You should be home back in Indy by 9 PM.

Join us for a great day and you won't be let down! Some of the best roads in Indiana and some of the best food in Cincinnati!


