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Dear Friends,

It is with great anticipation that we invite you all to take a cruise with us on 11/30/08. Royal Caribbean's Explorer of the Seas will be doing a 12 night Southern Caribbean cruise.

It will be sailing out of the Cape Liberty Cruise Port in Bayonne, New Jersey. The ports of call will be San Juan, Puerto Rico; Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas; Philipsburg, St. Maarten; Roseau, Dominica; Bridgetown, Barbados; St. Johns, Antigua; Tortola, British Virgin Islands; and then back to Cape Liberty Cruise Port, New Jersey. These are some of the best ports of call in all of the Caribbean!

Some examples of current pricing for the cruise are as follows:

Interior Stateroom Deck(s): Eight Occupancy: Up to 2 guests. (If you need more people per room, contact Cindy) Amenities: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), sitting area, vanity area, and a private bathroom. (160 sq. ft.) This is the least expensive room available on the ship. The price is \$1158.68 per person after taxes and port charges (not including airfare).

If you take the total of the room cost, divide it by the number of nights (12), it comes to \$96.56 per person per day. Where else can you take a vacation that includes your meals, your room, your entertainment, and visits to several different foreign ports of call for that amount of money?

Deluxe Oceanview Stateroom Deck(s): Eight, Nine Occupancy: Up to 2 guests. Amenities: Two twin beds (can convert into queen-size), private balcony, sitting area with sofa, and a private bathroom. Rates vary from deck to deck. (173 sq. ft., balcony 47 sq. ft.) The price is \$1468.68 per person (double occupancy). That brings it to 122.39 per person per day.

If you would like to obtain lots of valuable information, ask questions, and chat with other cruisers who are on the same sailing, please visit the Cruise Critic Message Boards at <http://boards.cruisecritic.com> or feel free to ask me any questions. If you join the boards, my name there is EggDropErin.

Here are the best parts...the deposit to go on this cruise is \$450 per person (at least for the first 2 occupants), which of course comes to \$900. This deposit MUST be paid by November 30, 2007! You will have until just over a month before the cruise to complete paying on it. That is well over a year away. There is no interest, and there is no set payment schedule. If you want to pay \$500 one month and not pay again for 2 more months, no problem! You just have to have it paid off by the final payment date.

Until that date, your deposit and what you have paid are fully refundable. You will be informed of your final payment date upon booking (it will be around a month or so before the cruise sets sail).

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This ship and the rest in its class are tied with being the third largest cruise ships sailing today (first would be the Freedom class of Royal Caribbean and second being the Queen Mary 2). Explorer of the Seas has all the bells and whistles you could ever want.

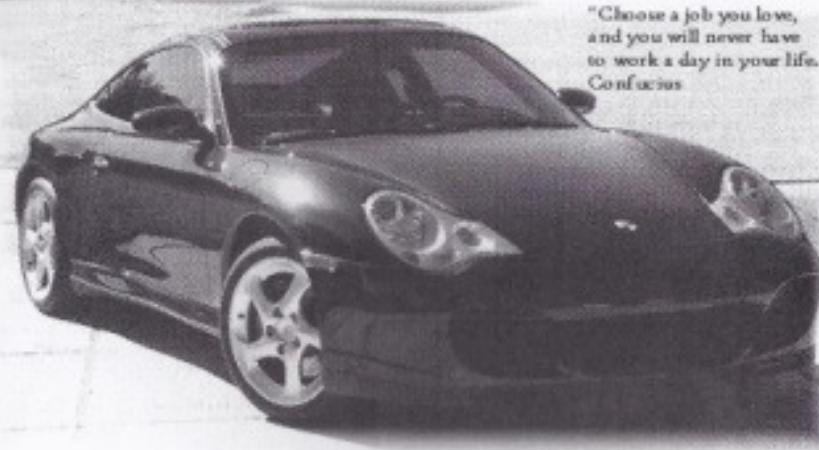
