The Kunstfest had a record 100 vendors of every description, selling homemade crafts and foods of every kind, including kraut balls (I'm guessing those are deep fried sauerkraut balls!), barbequed everything, bratwurst, pork chop dinners, chowder, fruit smoothies, kuchen, cider, homemade onsite apple butter, apple dumplings and slow churned ice cream. The music was as varied also with two dulcimer bands (one was an authentic mountain dulcimer band), a re-enactment Civil War band, a bluegrass band, the Wolfgang Classical Wind Ensemble & Singers and the Rhine Valley Brass Band (I think it was a full orchestra!) provided German favorites at the German Tent.

The 914 won Best of Show honors in the Sunday Car Show, shown by new members Bob and Janette Evans of Linton, Indiana. This was their first PCA event and Janette mentioned that she had

Another car of note in the show was Peter and Betsy Freed's 2008 Seal Gray Cayman S which was previously owned by the former American President of Porsche AG in Germany, Peter Schutz. Peter and Betsy recently moved back from Florida to Springfield, Ohio and Peter found

the car at Brumos Porsche in Jacksonville, Florida and the condition was perfect. The car was specially built for Mr. Schutz as part of his retirement package. He gets a new Porsche every two years! I still have a letter from Mr. Schutz, confirming his being our featured Guest Speaker at our very first Porsche Indy 500 Banquet back in 1988. Mr. Schutz was from Indiana, went to Purdue and had many connections here, having previously worked for Cummins in Columbus. He resigned from Porsche in Dec. of 1987 and we lost our guest speaker.

Thirty of us sat down to a wonderful dinner at the famous Red Geranium Restaurant Saturday night in the Paul Tillich Refectory Room. Peter Freed said it was the best dinner he had had in a long, long time and everyone seemed very pleased from a night to remember. I passed out the keepsakes from the weekend during dinner, which were made by Harmony Pottery – handmade stoneware food tiles which can be used to keep food (rolls, etc.) warm or cold during a meal. They matched our Car Show Trophy coffee mugs in colors and design.

After dinner, about 16 of us ventured out on a night walk of the illuminated Paul Tillich Memorial Park, the world famous Roofless Church designed by Philip Johnson, Carol's Memorial Garden and the Cathedral Labyrinth. Another 20 took the docent-led New Harmony Historical Sites walking tour during the Kunstfest Saturday afternoon. Were these the same people, I wonder? History buffs, romantics or both?



Matthias Müller Takes Wraps Off New Porsche Speedster

Stuttgart - September 29, 2010 - Matthias Müller, the new Chief Executive Officer of Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, unveiled the new Porsche 911 Speedster as well as the 911 Carrera GTS Coupé and Cabriolet models at the Paris Motor Show on Thursday, September 30.

An event organised by the Volkswagen Group on the evening before this autumn's leading motor show opens its doors will also see the official handover of responsibilities on the Porsche AG Board of Management. After a successful tenure Michael Macht will symbolically hand the Porsche steering wheel to his successor Matthias Müller. Matthias Müller's assumption of office as Chief Executive Officer coincides with three world debuts.



Only the fourth Speedster to have been built in Porsche's history is a model steeped in purist tradition and reflects the forward-looking nature of the brand, while the new Carrera GTS range with wide body and rear-wheel drive underscores all this.


