THE WAY IT WAS, September 2010 by Mike Robbins

A little over a year ago my contribution to the 2009 #3 *CIRcular* included an essay on the erroneous use of the word "marquee". After reading the August 2010 *CIRcular* I decided to submit it again. Here it is....somewhat edited and appended.



In your life have you had something that just drives you up the wall....like fingernails on a blackboard? There is a situation that affects me like that when people use the wrong word in reference to cars. This is normally a vocal situation but in the August 2010 *CIRcular* it is in print. Let me illustrate by comparing some words.

The two words "marquis" and "marquee" are pronounced the same but have totally different meanings. Ditto for the words "mark" and "marque". Let's take them individually. "Marquis" is a nobleman or a model of a Mercury automobile. "Marquee" is the portico or canopy over the entrance to a theater or sometimes used as an adjective to describe something as "first class". "Mark" in the old days could have been speaking of German currency but could also mean a reference point, score or other things. To close the international loop we've woven, we come to the French word "marque" which is generally used to identify the manufacturer of usually, automobiles. Now I ask you, which of these four words would be correct in the sentence "every conceivable variation of the Porsche marquee".

When I hear people mention the "Porsche marquee" [ooh, it even hurts to type it], the sound hits my ears where the sound is converted to electrical impulses that are sent to my brain. My brain converts the impulses to recognizable "sounds" that may have meaning as words or may just be "sounds", like that of a 4 cylinder Porsche Carrera engine [ahh, sweetness]. In the case of verbally connecting a theater entrance to a Porsche my brain has a severe reaction that can lead to whimpering, crying for my mother or at least an underbreath "arrgh". To see it in print just switches the sensory organ from the ears to the eyes.

The misuse of "marquee" is not just a local aberration. A few months ago a press release was issued by Porsche Cars North America that summarized the previous weekend's racing activity. After reviewing various class victories the writer threw in the phrase, "....a good weekend for the marquee". This from the agency that some considerone step from Valhalla. I wondered if one of the drivers was of French peerage and the writer's spell checker used the wrong "marquis". Not likely.

Have I made my point? Just for fun, how about, "The Marquis pulled his well known marque auto up to the marquee of the Rivoli and let his beagle out to mark his territory".

Or: 1st auto designer:" What do you think of that new Ford project for their Mercury division?" 2nd auto designer: "Oh, do you mean the Mercury Marquee?" continued next page

Or: Reviewer re de Sade's last essay: "Marquis' last is marquee job". [Now that one makes sense.]

Jay Leno's writers might do better but then they get paid a lot more.

While speaking of misused words, how about "concourse" for "concours". The word "concours" is part of the term "Concours de Elegance", a French expression used to define, in so many words, a "beauty contest for the design of utilitarian objects". [The "s" is silent.] It is used widely in describing events where automobiles are judged on their eye appeal, i.e. the designers' efforts. In car clubs it has come to mean a judging of the cleanliness and restoration to original specifications. If people want to use the word with the letter "e" ending, perhaps they should hold the event in an airport or railroad terminal. Have you seen the ads in car mags that tout a shop's "concourse preparation". Maybe too many writers have spell checkers that are discombobulated. And then there's the guy who guit reading the dictionary because it changed the subject so often.

Oh ,well! Back to tilting other windmills.


