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





Our box seats ("What great seats!") were perfect behind Home Plate and a little towards



#### THE WAY IT WAS by Mike Robbins

#### TEN YEARS AGO

The cover of the April 2001 *CIRcular* carried the emblem of CIR and the words "40<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY 1961-2001". Inside was an announcement of the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration at German Park, south of Indianapolis. The mag also had an announcement of a cruise to Kokomo. Visits were to be made to the 1890 Seiberling mansion and the Elwood Haynes Museum followed by dinner at a German restaurant. Sounds interesting. Maybe that could be repeated some time soon.

#### TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

The April 1986 *CIRcular* had coverage of the previous month's visit to Giganti VW-Porsche-Audi. The session was primarily devoted to 928 and 944 Porsches. Most of the presentation was made by Terry Heath, then wrenching at Giganti, now proprietor of Euro-Motorworks. Scott Holley wrote about automotive suspensions, defining terms

and explaining the functions. To cap the technical aspects, Jim Farmer, Service Manager at Giganti VW-Porsche-Audi wrote about vapor lock. There were announcements of several events to keep CIR members busy in coming weeks, the Braille Rally, Kentucky Region PCA's Porsche Derby and the Solo Series run in conjunction with SCCA.

#### LAST MONTH

To get up to more current events we'll give you a synopsis of the Porsche extravaganza in the Los Angeles area on the first weekend in March. Actually, I could copy the report I gave of last year's event and it would pretty well cover this year's. But that doesn't mean it was passe. Just because you had apple pie last week doesn't mean you can't enjoy another piece today. I had shipped some articles for the Literature-Automobilia meet and took advantage of Southwest Airlines liberal baggage allowance to take a giant piece of luggage along on the plane. That large second bag was packed with merchandise. I'd paid extra for early boarding of the plane so I could cop an aisle seat on the right side. That would allow me to stretch my left leg in the aisle to accommodate the slow-to-heal knee surgery of a few weeks past. Air travel can offer a lot of uncertainties but I have no complaints re this trip. Even with a change of planes in both the coming and going.

A friend from Texas and I shared a room at the headquarters hotel and on Friday morning we were met by another friend who had driven in from Phoenix. The three of us decided which of the seven or eight shops we would visit.. At the first we saw reproduction 356 fuel tanks made of aluminum, louvered 356 rear deck lids, nerf bars, through the hood fuel fillers, and other specialty fabrications as well as 356 cars under restoration.

On to the next shop that does primarily 356 restorations, both stock and custom. Shortly before we arrived they'd been demonstrating a twin ignition, fuel injected 356 engine. Well, it was based on a 356 engine. We missed that demo but soon our ears were assailed by the sound of a wild engine in an early VW Beetle running on a chassis dyno. The operator would fire up, run up to 6000 rpm and get readings. Make an adjustment or two, fire up again and reread. This was repeated over and over again with consistent readings over 200 HP at the wheels. I don't know what kind of tranny the bug had but I feel sure it was far from stock.

We closed our shop tours at The Parts Shop where there were several 356s, a couple of early 911s a 914-6, 550 and Elva -Porsche. Just looking at all of the parts on the shelves and in the bins makes one wonder if Porsche really built only 78,00 or so 356s. And to think that there are similar emporiums [emporia?] not only on southern CA but around the country. It's difficult to find parts for the very early cars [early '50s] but by the late '50s it gets significantly easier. There is enough demand that many NLA [no longer available] factory parts are being reproduced. For example, the owner of a restoration candidate can choose between several fabricators of floor pans for 356s.

Saturday morning found two ballrooms in the hotel filled with tables for Porscheniks to display their wares and a flood of other Porscheniks anxious to get an early shot at the goodies. Buyers could pay a premium entry fee to get in an hour ahead of the "regulars" and many did so.

I was unable to make the rounds to see what all was available from the myriad of vendors. When I say vendor I mean big commercial operations as well as little one guy rigs like me.

I had to stay with my table to try to sell my stuff. As I pursue disposition of a 50 year collection of Porsche parts and automobilia I frequently have to make a decision as to whether I should really let go of some things. The primary article of question this time was a map of Stuttgart Germany printed on silk fabric. With mixed emotions I sold it and maybe at less than market value. But it's one less thing to worry with and it now has a new happy owner.
