### **Porsche Restoration Project**



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## DRIVER'S EDUCATION

Putnam Park Driver Education: October 8-9, 2016

Sponsored by Tom Wood Porsche

Central Indiana Region of the Porsche Club of America (CIRPCA) is hosting our annual Pumpkin Run Driver Education event, sponsored by Tom Wood Porsche, at Putnam Park Road Course (www.putnampark.com) in Mt. Meridian, IN. on October 8-9, 2016. The driving season will be coming to a close soon, so why not close out the year with a great weekend of track fun.

Putnam Park is a favorite among racers and beginners alike. The 1.8 mile, 10 turn circuit is a great layout for beginning drivers, yet challenging enough for experts to hone their skills.

Our two day event will provide extensive track time, as well as classroom instruction. Beginning drivers and those with limited experience will have an experienced instructor in the seat next to you, ensuring that you learn the proper line around the track and safe driving technique. All of our great instructors are dedicated to making your experience FUN & SAFE! At the conclusion of the weekend, you will go home a better driver.

If you'd like more track time, during the lunch break you'll have the opportunity to participate in touring laps, at normal highway speeds. The best part is that you can take family and friends with you for the touring laps, with no helmets required. This is a great way to refine your driving line, locate landmarks on the track, and increase your comfort level.

Onsite Tech Inspection and Registration runs from 5:0pm- 9:00pm on Friday, October 7, at the Cambria Suites Hotel. For those unable to make it on Friday, tech. inspections and registration will continue from 7:00-8:00am on Saturday morning at the track. Student drivers (everyone other than instructors) are required to have a Tech Inspection Form completed by a qualified shop before presenting their cars for the onsite tech inspection and registration. Tech Inspection forms are available via the CIRPCA website or via clubregistration.net upon enrollment

**Student Sign-Up:** registration is via www.clubregistration.net. Search for "Putnam Park" events, and the dates of Oct 8-9. If you are new to clubregistration. net, you will first need to establish an account (no cost), and create a personal profile, which includes your relevant driving experiences. Cost for the entire weekend is \$350.

**Instructor Sign-Up:** must be a current CIRPCA approved instructor to register via clubregistration.net. Cost is \$100 for weekend. Any questions should be directed to

CIRPCA Chief Driving Instructor, Doug DeArmond at douglas.dearmond@cbre.com. **Rental Helmets:** a limited number are available at \$65 for the weekend. Please order during registration on clubregistration.net.

**Garage Rentals:** a limited number of garages are available during registration via clubregistration.net. Cost is \$125 for weekend and will hold 1 car. All garages are 1<sup>st</sup> come, 1<sup>st</sup> served.

**Hotel:** We've had great experience with the Cambria Suites. It's located just north of I-70, a few miles west of Indianapolis. **Hotel Driving Directions:** proceed westbound on I-70 for approx. 5 miles (west of the junction of I-70 and I-465 on Indy's west side). At exit 66 (State Rte 267) proceed north. Take 1<sup>st</sup> left onto Hadley Rd. Then take next left onto Gateway Dr. Hotel is located on right side.

**Directions to Putnam Park** (From I-70 west of Indianapolis): From I-465 on the west side of Indy, take I-70 westbound for approx. 30 miles. Take exit #41 (Cloverdale/Greencastle/ Rte 231) and proceed northbound on #231 for approx. 4 miles. At traffic light, turn right (east) onto US40. Proceed eastbound on US40 for approx. 4 miles (watch carefully for small green sign indicating Mt. Meridian). Just past the Mt. Meridian sign, turn right (south) onto County Rd. 550 E. 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# Brian Redman's Targa 66 Story and photos by Jim Hatfield



**A family reunion** in Delray Beach, Florida last February provided an opportunity to shoot a track event for Vintage Race Car magazine at nearby Palm Beach International Raceway. The event was Brian Redman's "Targa 66," a club event with loads of track time, but no races or even official timing. Brian Redman, a former Porsche and Ferrari factory driver, winner of countless sports car and formula races from the 1960s to the 1980s, is the founder, organizer and on-scene overseer of this event, along with his son, James. The goal of Targa 66 is to provide participants with a low pressure, fun weekend, devoid of the wheel to wheel competition that sometimes leads to tears and bent fenders or worse. Instead, participants are provided extensive track time and are divided into three groups, depending on the performance level of their vehicle and the skill level of the driver.



Such a relaxed event tends to bring out vintage machinery that is deemed irreplaceable or too valuable for the typical vintage race weekend. The selection of cars at this year's "Targa 66" was no exception and included several vehicles from the Revs Institute's Collier Museum Collection. Maybe the premier Porsche at this event was the Institute's 1958 Porsche-Behra Formula 2 machine that used components from a center seat 718 RSK sports car. Jean Behra, a noted French Formula 1 driver in the 1950s, bought the components from the factory and used them to build an open wheel F2 racer for the 1959 season. While it was extremely fast, Behra had little luck with it as a driver, but when Hans Herrmann drove the car for him, it finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the prestigious F2 race at Reims, France, beating the factory Porsche and Ferrari teams. Unfortunately, Behra was soon after killed in his RSK sports car

at the German Grand Prix at Avus. The little car was then taken over by the American Camoradi Team before eventually ending up in the U.S., gaining success in SCCA events. For this weekend, pro driver Gunnar Jeanette was entrusted with the driving.

The Revs Institute also brought arguably the most competitively successful Porsche 911R in existence. Driven this weekend by another pro driver, Roger Mandeville, the #181 car won the 1969 Tour de France Rally and Tour de Corsica with Gerard Larousse and Maurice Gelin. The 911R was a factory miss-step, seeing as the FIA, the governing body of motorsports, would not homologate this highly modified racer as a road car derivative. As a result the car was consigned to race uncompetitively as a Prototype. However, international Rallying had less stringent homologation rules, so the car had success on the Rally scene. Alas, joining the Targa 66 club requires some deep pockets and proper driving credentials, but for members, extensive and relaxed track time along with the off track camaraderie makes this event exceptional.

The Revs Institute (revsinstitute.org) hosts the Collier Collection in Naples Florida and is open for scheduled tours. Brian Redman also has an outstanding new book, "Daring Drivers, Dangerous Tracks – A Racer's Memoir of a Dangerous Decade 1965–1975," offered by Evro Publishing.

Other Porches of note included the Porsche 910 of Larry Wilson and the Porsche 962s of Bill Hawe (Jagermeister) and Angus Russell (Leyton House). Anyone who was around in the 1980s to witness these awesome machines could still get chills as they circulated the track at speed.

Of course, some non-Porsche entries were equally spectacular, including a 1966–7 Alfa Romeo T33 and a 1965 F1 Ferrari 1512. This was an authentic Ferrari Formula 1 car that escaped end of season destruction, the typical fate of obsolete team cars. The Revs Institute also brought its 1966 Ford GT40 Mk I while a club member brought his 1989 Group C Aston Martin AMR1, a car that was the last Brian Redman drove in competition.

And, by the way, If you choose to get a polymer coating applied, there's no long waiting to drive 'er home. The protected car will be good to take home after 12 hours – and fully cured after a few days.





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
