

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I recently attended the annual Zone 4 Presidents' Meeting in Toledo. Lots of great ideas and information were exchanged, and we also had the opportunity to interact with a number of PCA National volunteers, including the President, Caren Cooper. I came away with a sense that our National colleagues devote a tremendous amount of time and energy to making our Club the best car club in the world! Most of these folks give 30-40 hrs per week to PCA related work – and that's on top of their personal careers!!!!! I know it's easy to grouse about some of the things we think should be done differently at National, but let's never lose sight of the fact that they are volunteers, like us, and they do this just because they love this Club and its' members.

I would like to relate to you a couple of the key points that Caren Cooper made during her presentation and interaction with the Region Presidents and Officers in attendance. I was shocked to learn that there are only 2 insurance companies in the US who will write liability policies for high performance car clubs. And in today's litiginous society, PCA could not conduct any driving events without having liability coverage. Secondly, PCA has the best safety record of any of these types of car clubs, and this means we enjoy the lowest premiums of all of them. As an example, for our upcoming Spring Brake HPDE event (high performance driver education), our Club only pays a premium of \$600 to insure all participants against liability, covering over 100 drivers, travelling at racing speeds, over a 3 day period. And there are two reasons why this is so: PCA (and CIR) places tremendous focus on safety; and our drivers respect the rules and conduct themselves in a responsible manner.

And let's consider another driving event which so many of you enjoy – driving tours. Liability insurance for these types of events are provided by PCA at no additional cost to the Regions! Once again, it is the focus on safety and the responsible conduct of our drivers that makes this possible. Now, I would like to elaborate just a bit on some of the discussion we had at the Presidents' meeting on the subject of driving tours. Believe it or not, driving tours generate more liability claims, and even a few serious accidents, than any other activity which PCA sponsors. More claims than DE events, and more claims than PCA Club Racing! And while the vast majority of our drivers behave very responsibly during tours, there are a very few who think that a tour is their best chance to REALLY FIND OUT WHAT MY PORSCHE CAN DO!

Unfortunately, this prompts these few drivers to hammer on the gas, pass where there are double yellow lines, and even to pass on blind curves and hills! These types of incidents, and PCA's desire to protect our future insurability, have prompted PCA to create a set of driving tour guidelines which you will learn about at your next tour. I'm happy to say that there's nothing onerous about them, and they simply demand that we all drive with common sense. But if you are expecting to use a CIR driving tour as an opportunity to "air out" your car, you're in the wrong event. That's what DE events and PCA Club Racing are intended for, not driving tours!!!

Wow - I just realized that this is sounding pretty negative, but there is a very bright side. I've been a PCA member for over 13 years, and I've been on lots of driving tours and have logged quite a few miles on race tracks, during DE events, and I have NEVER SEEN AN INJURY TO ANYONE! This is not to say that they are not possible, but our members are consistently aware of the need to drive responsibly! That's why I say that Porsche people are the best – and it's reflected in our safety record and our insurance rates!

And I would be remiss not to recognize those CIR Officers who gave up their weekend to participate in the Toledo meeting, so I'd like to thank our VP, Rebecca Pinto (as well as Brian), and our Ft. Wayne Activity Chair, Jimmy Arata (as well as Maureen), for adding their comments and support to this important meeting.

Well, in closing, the driving season is here, and we have an action-packed April and May in front of us, so I hope to see many of you on our Taj Ma Garaj tour, our Spring Color Tour, our Spring Brake DE, the Indy Grand Prix, and our social gatherings.

Philanthropy: Another P-Word That Shapes How CIR Rolls

The Central Indiana Porsche Club has a long history of maintaining a philanthropic focus while engaging in the very important business of enjoying our cars and the member-enthusiasts who drive them. In commenting on this dual focus recently to our current CIRPCA president, Bruce Fleischmann, I put it this way: "...philanthropy grounds us and makes us more relatable." Translation: we see ourselves as more than just having very nice cars (though we do)! And more than just having fun (though we do, we do)! We also see ourselves as a part of a larger Central Indiana community and, along with many other organizations, see it as the right thing to do.

Here at CIRPCA, we have events that appear on our on-line calendar year-after-year that contribute to keeping our treasury sound. These include track events, car shows and car tours. But while we're very keen on fiscal health, the club annually donates 10% of our annual assets over our minimum operating budget to philanthropy. Recommendations on organizations that could use our help are solicited from club members. Then a board vote is taken regarding where contributions should go for the fiscal year. \$2,000 and larger contributions have been made to the research arm of the Alzheimer's Association's Greater Indiana Chapter, The Peyton Manning Children's Hospital, Wounded Warriors, and Little Sisters of the Poor.'s St. Augustine home based in Indianapolis.

Our primary "money-maker" is a car show, for charity, held each year in June: CRUZionsville. The main man in charge of making all of the arrangements each year is Steve Tarr, long-standing CIRPCA member and Zionsville resident. The show has run for six consecutive years, and counting. Proceeds each year go entirely to the research arm of the Alzheimer's Organization (Greater Indiana Chapter) Come event day, Main Street in Zionsville is lined with Porsches to entice local car lovers to come and get a little taste of

what attracts us to the cars and comradery that is CIRPCA. But that's not all. Tarr arranges fashion shows presented by local dress shops, wine tastings and car-related vendors' booths – even a visit by Miss Indiana – all designed to help attract a diverse audience to attend the show each year. Last year, CruZionsville generated a \$20,000 donation to the Alzheimer's Association's Greater Indiana Chapter. Over its' 6 year history over \$70,000 has been donated,, making CruZionsville one of the top 5 fundraisers in the State of Indiana to benefit the Alzheimer's Association and the Greater Indiana Chapter.

Whether a member of the club or the general public, current calendar activities are available for perusing and event sign-up at www.cirpca.org This year, we're sponsoring and/or helping to advertise CRUZionsiville, Artomobilia in Carmel, the Spring Color Tour to Cincinnati, the 2nd Columbus Architectural Tour, and a Street Survival clinic (a Girls Day Out for our female members to sharpen their daily driver - Porsche-or-not - car control skills). The Street Survival event was inspired by the Teen Street Survival program that CIR co-sponsors with major national sponsors. Both events are aimed at teaching drivers vital car control techniques to use in both emergency situations and challenging road conditions likely encounter on a regular basis, with the focus being on helping them transfer the skills they learn to the road, when they don't have an instructor in the car!.

Our philanthropic purpose, an offshoot of commitment to community involvement and support, provides one more way that CIR-PCA fully embraces our national PCA affiliate's slogan: It's not the cars, it's the people.











CIRPCA Remembrance

Central Indiana Region / Porsche Club of America is sorry to announce the passing of longtime member Larry Dent, 83, of Auburn on April 10, 2017. Larry was a member of CIR for 42 years and was a frequent attendee of Fort Wayne area breakfasts and events at Porsche Fort Wayne and SweetCars with his wife Linda. Larry was also a 55 year member of Sports Car Club of America / Fort Wayne Region and elected to their National Hall of Fame and awarded their Woolf Bamato Award. He and Linda attended just about every SCCA track event in the Midwest. Many remember his booming voice as the official Track Announcer at Mid-Ohio Race Course. Larry also held a stint as a TV weatherman for WKJG in Fort Wayne. In the business world,



Larry was Vice President of K & K Insurance in Fort Wayne and negotiated PCA's very first national liability insurance contract for club events. He retired from 3M where he was a technical sales rep for the printing division. Past Executive Director of the National Auto and Truck Museum in Auburn, he was also on the board of the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum there. Larry owned many important sports and other cars during his lifetime. For years his beautiful bright red 1950's Alfa Romero Mexico that raced in Formula One was a featured exhibit at the ACD Museum. Only two were ever made. Larry was a great guest speaker and could thrill audiences with his stories of past adventures in automotive racing. He was media representative for the famous All-American 1967 24 Hrs. of LeMans-winning Ford GT-40 team of Dan Gurney and A J Foyt. This was the race where Dan Gurney initiated the tradition of winners spraying the audience with champagne. Need I say more? I knew Larry off and on for 38 years, but really didn't get to know him well until the last 10 years. He was a giant in the sports car world, but he was also a true gentleman and always had a smile and time to talk to anyone he met. He will be missed by all of us who knew him.



Bilt for Bill

This story started on February 19, 2013. That's when I sat admiring my 1982 guards red 924 Turbo, freshly preserved and ready for the 2013 Traverse City, Michigan Porsche Parade. That is also when I realized that it was my brother's birthday that day. So, I dedicated my 19th Porsche to my brother Bill and signed the door in his honor. He always loved the red Porsches I owned.

Bill Griffin was different and special. He was born with Down Syndrome, but that did not stop him from wanting or having his own "wheels". After mastering the skill of riding a bike, he became well known pedaling around through town, touching the lives and hearts of everyone he met.



Realizing that my brother was now 53 and I was 56, I thought he might want some assistance getting around his hometown with his bicycle. So, I came up with "Bilt for Bill", a hybrid electric assist and pedal power bike, custom made by me. Utilizing a 24 volt hub motor on the front wheel and sourcing out electronics made from a discarded child's two wheel scooter.

With some Porsche 924 headlight doors aerodynamically covering the front hub motor and other Porsche sheet metal used to enclose the center frame battery box of my wife's mountain bike, the bike came to life in June of 2013.



I subsequently delivered the bike to Bill in my 924 Turbo to the town of Darlington, Pennsylvania, where he lived. Even though Bill and I were different from each other, one thing we would come to have in common was a love of Porsches. I would go on to be a Porsche factory trained technician, work on and own many Porsches. Bill would go on learning as much as he could, becoming a treasured member of his community and pedaling around in the town he knew so well.



I wish that I would have had more time with Bill and his new bike to show him more about having power at one's control.

I don't honestly know how much Bill actually rode the bike over the next three years until his passing in September of 2016, but I know I've probably put more hours on the bike than Bill, for sure.



Bill's passing changed a lot of lives, he is truly missed and it was an honor having him as my brother. He showed honesty, openness and caring to everyone he met. Eventually, I got the bike back. Now what do I do with it?

Along comes Werks Reunion and the Amelia Island Concours in northeast Florida in March of this year with their many auction houses to sell some of the best automotive art on wheels. A plan is hatched to auction the bike off at Werks Reunion and donate the proceeds to the Down Syndrome Foundation of Western Pennsylvania. Hollywood Wheels, Werks Reunion's sponsor, is so impressed with the "Bilt for Bill" story that they decide to include the bike in their auction.



The bike has become a true "Porsche Story" and history of love. The bike eventually sold for \$5,000 and all of this money went to the Western Pennsylvania Down Syndrome Association of Pittsburgh, PA.

Recently I got a phone message from the director of the Western Pennsylvania Down Syndrome Assoc. The lady was sooo excited about the \$5,000 donation, almost to the point I thought they may have never received such a large donation before! Bill was rare.

In closing, to all Porsche people that can give, this one is very worthwhile.



Track Day: Father and Son


Spring Break DE, April 28-30 2011

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

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
CruZionsville registration is now open!






