



Greetings PCA Zone 4 Members,

After waiting for several months to see if there was going to be a PCA Car Corral at the Detroit Grand Prix at Belle Isle, with less than 2 weeks notice, I was contacted and asked if I was interested in hosting the event. I agreed to take on this task, and the first step was to put together a thorough proposal, which needed to be submitted to the EC for approval in order to get funding. I received word that my proposal was approved and that I could begin promoting the event a mere 10 days before it began. For the next 10 days, I spent nearly every minute of the day promoting, preparing for, and coordinating every aspect of this 3 day event, including a hotel room block, a welcome dinner, and police escorted caravan, as well as determining the amenities at the Hospitality Tent and the car corral itself.

Through a number of Zone blasts, and with the cooperation of the regions within Zone 4, we were able to properly promote the event. Once again, ticket sales for Saturday surpassed the track's expectations, and we had to request an additional allocation of tickets.

A room block was set up at The Henry Autograph Hotel to accommodate anyone travelling from out of town. On Friday evening, we had a nice turnout for dinner at TRIA Restaurant. The group consisted of members representing 7 different regions.

PCA members and Porsche owners, who visited the hospitality tent, were treated to donuts, coffee, and bagels in the morning, as well as water and soft drinks throughout the course of the day. In addition to people from throughout Zone 4, attendees included PCA members from Florida, Las Vegas, and Oregon that had travelled to Detroit just for this event.

On Saturday morning, 2 Michigan State Police cars arrived at The Henry to provide us with an escort to the corral. Drivers and passengers in 23 cars met under the portico to sign waivers and receive instructions during the Driver's Meeting. With our police escorts leading the way and blocking oncoming traffic, we set out on a nonstop 20-mile drive through the streets of Detroit, including a 3-mile stretch along Downtown Detroit's main thoroughfare, across the scenic MacArthur Bridge onto Belle Isle, and straight to the car corral. Everyone who participated agreed that it was even more fun than they had anticipated.



When we arrived at the corral, we were greeted with coffee and donuts, as the warm up began for the WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. Arrangements were made to allow a large group to tour the Park Place Transporter along with a question and answer session with driver Patrick Lindsey. The group was then surprised with a 2nd transporter visit to Alegra Motorsports and a private autograph session with drivers Daniel Morad and Mathieu Jaminet.

Over the course of the weekend, attendees were able to enjoy races from the Verizon IndyCar series, the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship, the Trans Am series presented by Pirelli, and the SPEED Energy Stadium SUPER Trucks. The Detroit Grand Prix is the only weekend to feature back to back days of full points IndyCar races. And, for the first time in this race's history, the same driver won both Saturday's and Sunday's races; congratulations to Graham Rahal.

Putting an event of this magnitude together requires a considerable amount of time and effort. With only 10 days until the event, I had to work night and day in order to accomplish the goal. I want to thank everyone that attended, and to all of the regions that assisted me by promoting the event. I especially want to thank my dependable team of trusted volunteers whose hard work and contributions helped to make this a successful event.

Brake Pad Dust Cure on Alloy Wheels

After owning our 2000 Boxster S for almost 13 years, I finally decided to try to do something about the chronic black brake pad dust problem on our beautiful alloy wheels, which plagues so many German car owners. I had been hearing for years that the new ceramic brake pads could offer some hope. Several PCA members have purchased the very expensive Ceramic Brake Option on their new Porsches and have noticed that their brake dust problem has been reduced drastically. This Porsche option includes ceramic brake rotors along with ceramic compound brake pads on all four wheels. Last year I replaced the front brake pads with ceramic pads on my 2003 Ford Taurus, before I sold it. NAPA told me that all the fleet companies have switched to ceramic brake pads for longer pad life, less rotor wear and brake dust. Although brake dust was never a problem on the alloy wheels on the Taurus, I decided to give them a try there first before installing them on the Boxster and I was pleased with the results.

I've been noticing that Pelican Parts has been carrying Hawk Performance Ceramic brake pads for our Boxster S for a few years and though more expensive than the stock Porsche pads, they promised "ultra-low dust, increased stopping power, longer rotor life, extended pad life and low noise". Noise has never been a problem and we replaced all four cast iron rotors in the past year and our stock brake pads were just about worn out. So, I decided to take the plunge and ordered Hawk Performance Ceramic brake pads for all four wheels plus all new brake mounting hardware (new retainer pins, spring retainers, clips and pad dampers) for around \$600. You can reuse your old mounting hardware and pad dampers if they are okay, but since we decided to have all four red calipers repainted, I replaced all the hardware also. Our pretty red calipers clear coat was starting to peal away and they didn't look too sharp anymore and it was time for a repaint with new white "Porsche" vinyl lettering, which was all done by SweetCars in Fort Wayne. If you don't let your brake pads wear down to where the brake wear sensor warning lights come on in your dash, you can also reuse your old brake pad wear sensors, which we did.

So far, we have been very happy with the results. You will still have some brake dust, just not as severe and a lighter color than with the standard Porsche pads. Another trick is to ceramic clear coat the calipers and wheels and the dust supposedly just slides off the new slippery surfaces.

There is an electrostatic process that attracts brake dust (negative charge) to the alloy wheels (positive charge), I've been told and this eliminates it.

You can be rest assured that Hawk Performance brake components are some of the best in the world and made here in the US. I attended a CIR Hawk Racing Brake Tech Session a few years ago and was very impressed with their quality and support. They are well respected in the racing world, plus come with a limited lifetime warranty!

Around The Zone




Greetings PCA Zone 4 Members,

Chasing the Tail of the Dragon with Treffen



Dates are Wednesday, Sept. 20 thru Sunday, Sept 24, and the location is the Omni Grove Park Inn in Asheville, NC. The key thing to know is that registration opens tomorrow. According to our Zone 4 Representative PCA expects this event to sell out very quickly, so if you plan to go, plan accordingly. So far, we have several members interested in making it to this event. Some of the CIR board members are also planning to go.

If you've never heard of Treffen, Treffen North America is Porsche Club of America's newest national event, featuring three days of non-competitive touring, creative dining events and the opportunity to explore exciting destinations while staying at some of the finest resorts North America. Translated from German, Treffen means "to meet," and you're sure to meet new people and make new friends. Treffen and Porsche Parade destinations are selected to offer annually a national PCA activity within driving distance of the membership. Here's a brief list of key info:

Registration includes continental breakfast each day, and the evening meal each day, along with the welcome reception. Cost is \$395 per person, which does NOT include the hotel. Treffen says they've negotiated a very good room rate, for information visit the Treffen website.

IndyCar Grand Prix a Day at IMS

Central Indiana Region had a perfect day, perfect weather and a perfect race run by Will Power and the Roger Penske Team for the fourth running of the IndyCar Grand Prix of Indianapolis in mid-May. Fifty Central Indiana Region members and guests watched the race from the CIR block of "The Best Seats in the House", directly above the Indianapolis Motor Speedway's Road Course Turn 1, where all the hard braking and jockeying for position is done at the end of the Oval's long Main Straight. We could see the cars coming out of the Pits, the entire Main Straight, six road course turns and part of the Back Straight from our high-up seats and had a state-of-the-art new Jumbotron directly across from us to see action on other parts of the circuit. Will Power was fastest in practice, fastest in qualifying and fastest in the race. He led 61 of the 85 laps with teammate Helio Castroneves leading most of the other laps until the end when Will took back over. It was a very safe race with no full course cautions for the 22 cars that started the race. The only incident came on the 2nd lap when Marco Andretti cut of Tony Kanaan in one of the turns, which neither ever fully recovered from. The racing was so close that no mistakes were allowed and passing was frequent, mostly right in front of us in Turn 1. Graham Rahall drove the best race of anyone, starting 20th and finishing 6th. Scott Dixon finished 2nd with Ryan Hunter-Reay coming in 3rd. CIR's Tickets for next year's race go on sale in late January at ClubReg. See you at Indy!














What is a Driver's Ed event?

Simply put, a "DE" event is the opportunity to drive your Porsche at speed on a track in a very safe environment. CIR PCA often refers to DE as "Safe, Serious, Fun." Tracks CIR members can be seen on include some you have heard of like MidOhio and the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. CIR typically hosts two events during the year at Putnam Park Raceway



The Safety aspects include a complete pre-event Technical Inspection of your Porsche and a daily trackside Technical Inspection (otherwise referred to as "Tech"). All drivers wear helmets and seat belts (CIR has a limited number of loaner helmets available to new drivers). The track itself is carefully inspected and supervised by our Chief Instructors. While on the track, drivers rely on Flags and Flaggers for advance knowledge about what is around the next corner. And passing is only allowed on straight sections, with a signal from the car being overtaken. New drivers have an instructor assigned for each event.





Serious means that we approach driving at speed with all due respect. A drivers meeting starts each day at the track. Track conditions are described along with any other factors that may affect that day's driving. Student drivers meet their instructor and discuss the area(s) they will focus on for each run. Classroom sessions introduce and reinforce a variety of topics including car behavior such as understeer and oversteer as well as driving techniques such as trail braking.

The Fun part is driving on track 3 to 4 sessions each day! Students drive at a pace they are comfortable with, knowing that their instructor will keep them safe. Virtually every new driver has a big smile when they step out of their car after every session. As a bonus, you will meet many other driving enthusiasts and have many opportunities to socialize.

One final note: Drivers Education is NOT racing! We do not teach racing techniques and our events are not intended to be practice for racing. Racers can sign up for PCA Club Race events.

You will find that attending DE events improves your street driving through improved awareness of your Porsche's abilities, and your own.

None of these volunteers are paid, and they contribute so that all of us can share in the camaraderie and good times that CIRPCA is famous for. You may have noticed that many of the same faces keep showing up in leadership positions. It's great that we have such dedicated people, who are ALWAYS THERE, but it's important that we welcome and involve new folks into our Club activities so that CIRPCA remains a fun place for everyone, with a great variety of activities to suit all interests.

As the end of 2017 approaches, it's time for the Board to assemble a slate of officer candidates for 2018 and beyond. There are several officers whose terms will conclude at the end of 2017, including the President and the Membership Chair, plus there are often changes in other Board positions that create new opportunities for interested members. It is vital to the health of our Club that we constantly bring new faces onto the Board. This helps to ensure that we remain open to new ideas and interests, and don't get stuck too much in old ways of doing things.

In the hope of sparking your interest, here's a brief overview of all the Board positions. Please recognize that most positions require no special skills, or prior Board experience. The time commitment for most positions is generally a couple of hours a week, plus attending the Board meetings on the 1st Wednesday evening of each month (and everyone occasionally misses a meeting).

Vice President: substitutes for the President in his/her absence. May be involved in selected special projects at the request of the Board.

Treasurer: responsible for managing all aspects of the Club's finances. Pays bills, works with Club accountant to file necessary tax paperwork. Keep accurate records of income and expenses.

Recording Secretary: takes minutes of Board meetings. Manages officer election process each year. Membership Chair: endeavors to attract new members and enhance the membership experience through communications with Club members and PCA National.

Activities Chair: oversees the Club's calendar of events, and sets up recurring activities as well as facilitating the inclusion of new activities.

At-large Board members: the Board is empowered to appoint up to 6 at-large members to represent the membership. These are not elected positions. Currently we have 4 at-large, voting members, including Randy Faunce, Rob Fike, Jimmy Arata (Ft. Wayne Activities Chair) and Sima Sciopu (Newsletter Editor).

With all this in mind, our Nominating Committee (chaired by Rebecca Pinto, VP) is searching for candidates for any/all Board positions, now or in the future. If you have an interest in any of these positions you can let us know in a variety of ways:

-attend any monthly Board meeting. Check it out for yourself. All members are welcome at any meeting. Board meetings are held on the 1st Wed of each month, and begin with a social hour at 6:00 (optional dinner), and the meeting from 7:00 – 9:00pm.
