





2018 Spring Brake Driver Education April 27, 28, & 29

Sponsored by TOM WOOD PORSCHE

The Central Indiana Region of the Porsche Club of America is pleased to announce an exciting 3 day track event at the newly repaved Putnam Park Road Course, in Mt. Meridian, IN, on Friday – Sunday, April 27 – 29, 2018. Saturday and Sunday will be a traditional Driver Ed program, open to drivers of all levels, driving any make of vehicle, from 1st time track drivers thru advanced drivers. Friday will feature open lapping for advanced drivers (those who do not require Instructors).

Putnam Park has always been a great track for both novices and advanced drivers, but 2018 should be especially exciting because Putnam Park has recently undergone a COMPLETE REPAVING OF THE ENTIRE TRACK! In 2017, participants noticed far less tire wear than the previous surface. In addition, wet weather traction is outstanding!

Friday, April 27th will be open for any advanced drivers, who have previously driven in either the Instructor, A or B groups with CIRPCA, or other advanced driving groups in other organizations, who do not require an Instructor. We anticipate between 3-4 hours of open track time for these advanced drivers. What a great way to enhance your skills, with lots of time on a less crowded track!

As always, our Saturday and Sunday DE event, features lots of track time, along with classroom training, to ensure everyone goes home a better driver. It is open to all licensed drivers, 18 and over, driving any make vehicle. Membership in PCA is not a requirement! Instructors will be provided for all drivers at the beginning or novice levels.

As always, participating vehicles require the completion of a Technical Inspection form by a qualified mechanic (inspected and signed no early than 30 days prior to the event) before presenting the vehicle at the track for final inspection. Final on-site tech inspection will be available on Friday morning at the track, and again Saturday morning at the track. Drivers must

bring their completed and signed tech forms to one of the onsite tech inspections. Tech forms are available on the registration website and also on the CIRPCA website by clicking on the Driver Ed icon. More details will be posted at a later time.

Student Registration

Registration is via www.clubregistration.net. Search for Putnam Park events, and the dates of April 27-29. If you are new to Club Registration, you will first need to establish an account (no cost), and create a personal profile, which includes your relevant driving experiences.

After MARCH 1st, the event fees will be as follows: Cost for the 3 day event (advanced drivers) is \$600. Cost for the Saturday – Sunday event for all students is \$425.

CIRPCA Approved Instructors may register for Saturday and Sunday for \$125.

One day may be purchased for \$250.

Instructor Registration

Anyone registering to instruct must be an approved CIRPCA instructor. Questions here can be directed to the registrar. There may be some time Friday and during the weekend to evaluate and coach advanced drivers that may be interested in instructing in the future. Anyone interested can please reach out to our Chief Driving Instructor — Doug DeArmond at douglas_dearmond@yahoo.com.

Helmets:

Only Snell certified helmets, carrying a 2010 or 2015 sticker, will be allowed. A limited number of rental helmets are available, via the clubregistration website at \$65 for the entire weekend.

Garage Rental:

A limited number of single bay spaces are available for \$150 for the entire weekend. All garages are 1st come, 1st served, and may be reserved via Clubreg. Vehicles can be left in the garage for the weekend and there is

power & compressed air available.

Again this year, a very large convention in Indianapolis has made it difficult to secure a "headquarters" hotel, but there are a number of options available:

PCA Treffen - Tamaya, New Mexico

Hyatt Regency Tamaya Resort, Santa Ana Pueblo, New Mexico (halfway between Albuquerque & Santa Fe)
April 25-28, 2018

PCA Treffens used to be called Escapes. There are now two Treffens per year. PCA's Spring Treffen will be headquartered at the Hyatt Regency Tamaya Resort in Santa Ana



Pueblo, New Mexico from April 25-28 and hosted by Roadrunner Region. The Fall PCA Treffen will be held at Banff, Alberta, Canada in the Canadian Rockies on September 12-15 hosted by Wild Rose Region.

PCA Treffens differ from the annual week-long Porsche Parade held in the summer by being shorter four-day events that are all social and tour-type events with no competitive events. Porsches are not required, but encouraged on the driving tours. \$450/person Registration Fee includes 1 reception, 3 breakfasts, 3 dinners and event apparel (name tags).

The festivities open with a reception on Wednesday evening, driving tours on Thursday and Saturday, Navigator's Day Off with bus tours on Friday and checkout and travel home on Sunday. Daily Driving & Bus Tours are extra cost and usually include lunch. Free Self-Guided walking tours are also available daily.

Once you register and pay the Registration Fee, you will be given a Porsche Club Group Code to use to register for hotel rooms at the resort at a substantially discounted rate. You can also register for all the tours and other activities. Many popular tours that previously sold out have since added additional tours.

Registration opened January 17 at: Treffen.PCA.org. Make sure you are logged in first at: www.pca.org, using your PCA login (not your CIR login) that came with your PCA Membership Card, before trying to register.

This resort has a wide variety of hotel rooms, condos and stand alone houses available, so plan ahead if you plan to share housing with others.

The latest info from PCA is that the Tan-Tar-A Resort is almost sold out and they have added three nearby hotels to accommodate additional Parade attendees. Many CIR members are planning on attending this very close Porsche Parade.

The Porsche Parade was last held at the Tan-Tar-A Resort in 1983 and your correspondent attended. It was a great Parade!

New CIRPCA Web Site!



You have probably noticed that the CIR web site has a new look. The reason for that is that we have migrated to a different web hosting platform. This is our third platform change in ten years. Our previous platform was hosted by the Porsche Club of America. We used their facility for nearly eight years at no cost. This saved the CIR a lot of money at a very financially difficult time in the club's history.

We were recently told that platform was going away but we were given no time frame so there was no rush. However, we wanted to get the site up and functioning before our list of calendars events got too busy. We are very grateful to the PCA for providing that service at a difficult time in the club's history as well as the support they provided for that platform. It allowed the club to grow into a robust site and gain experience using a total functioning site.

It also set expectations and requirements of what the new site should be able to deliver to the CIR membership. Even though the CIR is much more financially stable now, one of the expectations was minimal costs. The entire cost of the new site is a few hundred

dollars. Part of this cost is to pay for the site hosting for years into the future. The remainder was for software licensing for a few of the plugins such as the calendar, site maintenance and so on. The on-going cost yearly will be less than \$100.

We're excited by the new web site. We think it is cleaner looking, easier to navigate and has more functionality. It is also much more flexible in what it can do and there are many more software packages available, nearly all of them for free.

Of course, nothing is ever completely perfect. We are not able to migrate all of the images from events or members' car images, so we will ask you to send them in again.

Also, we were unable to migrate members' credentials. Those credentials were only used to register for events. The registration process on the new site is different. There is no login on the new site. Each event will ask for registration information. If the event requires fees, these fees will processed via a PayPay portal.

A lot of the contents are the same. We still have the President's Message, the CIRcular newsletters, the Goodie Store, and we could not forget our sponsors who provide so much assistance to the club.

In addition to the CIR events calendar, we have links to all of the regions that border the CIR. We still have the Contact Us page with an email link for each elected board member. We have some new features as well. We display the Facebook posts on the home page and have a Membership page to show how the CIR is growing. And yes, we still have a page where you can order the CIR name tags.

We've come a long way in the ten years that the club has had a working web site. We think you'll like the new site and find the environment easier to use and more enjoyable. wanting to become more active in the club again, but I guess we should be more careful about what we wish for!


