President's Message

June is CruZionsville and French Lick Porsche Parade month! This is the most exciting month ever in the history of Central Indiana Region/Porsche Club of America. The Porsche Parade has never been in Indiana and this is the 60th Anniversary Porsche Parade and it's here! Our CruZionsville all-Porsche Charity Car Show, supporting the Alzheimer's Association — Greater Indiana Chapter, will kick off on Saturday, June 13 with a whole day of activities on the picturesque brick streets of downtown Zionsville for its 5th anniversary! The French Lick Porsche Parade will be June 21 – 27 in beautiful southern Indiana and you don't want to miss it!

As of May 27 there are 958 cars registered for the French Lick Porsche Parade That's about 2,000 participants with dealers, sponsors, PCNA, Porsche AG, Porsche family and support people included and that's what they had at the Traverse City Porsche Parade in 2013, which set many records. CIR has 84 of those cars registered (we had 27 at Traverse City) for potentially 160 CIR members attending – a record turnout!

If you tried to register on March 17 for the French Lick Porsche Parade and were disappointed on how difficult it was to use the Parade website and gave up, I sincerely encourage you to try again as it is now much easier to use (I registered for everything in one hour early in the morning on March 18) and you don't want to miss this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. New very nice hotels have been added on the Parade website in French Lick and Jasper (1/2 hour south on IN- 56) and the Parade Goodie Store, Hospitality, Art Show, Tech Sessions and Registration are all headquartered at the beautifully restored French Lick Springs Resort Hotel and open to all PCA members.

The Sunday evening Parade Welcome Party will be at the French Lick Springs Resort Gardens behind the hotel. Tuesday evening will be the Concours Banquet and Saturday evening is the final Victory Banquet, both under the spectacular Atrium Dome at the West Baden Springs Resort Hotel. The Wednesday evening TSD Rally Banquet will be at the West Baden Springs Riding Stables for an outdoor barbecue. Friday evening is the Autocross Banquet held at the French Lick Windsor Ballroom. You can also purchase a Parade Box Lunch for the Concours and a free Parade Ice Cream Social ends the Rally Tuesday afternoon. Tickets are still available to all these exciting banquets and socials until June 14 at www.pca.org, but you have to be a Parade Registrant to purchase one.

Monday and Thursday are Parade Free Nights with no banquets planned. I hear there is a great new German Restaurant in downtown French Lick and Larry Bird has probably the best collection of his basketball memorabilia at the Brick Street Inn. Then there is always the famous Schnitzelbank German Restaurant down in Jasper about a half hour south of French Lick via IN-56 & US 231 South.

Parade Banquet & Social tickets are always for sale on the Bulletin Board in Parade Hospitality from members who had to cancel or bought too many tickets. Banquets later in the week are easier to obtain as some have to go home early.

Travel Directions from Indy

From the northeast area on I-465, take the I-69 exit north toward Fishers/Ft. Wayne. Exit I-69 at 116th Street (Fishers) and proceed east (right) for approximately 4 miles. At the signal at the intersection of 116th & Olio Road, turn south (right) onto Olio and proceed across the bridge over the lake. At the 1st signal after the bridge, turn right onto Springstone Road; travel approximately ¾ mile, then turn right onto Water Ridge. House will be on your left.

Travel Directions from north

From southbound I-69, take Exit 210 (Campus Pkwy). Turn east (left) at the top of the ramp and proceed to the roundabout. Take the 2nd exit off the roundabout onto Olio Road southbound. Proceed south on Olio for approximately 4 miles, crossing the lake. Once across the lake, turn right at the 1st signal onto Springstone Road; proceed approximately ¾ mile, then turn right onto Water Ridge. House will be on your left.

Greetings PCA Zone 4 Members,

According to PCA Concours Chair Paul Gilbreath, there has not been a National Concours Judges School held in approximately 10 years, and PCA Concours Chair Ron Gordon has confirmed that there has never been a National Concours Judges School held in Zone 4. So it is with great pleasure that I am able to announce to you that after months of planning, hard work, and a little lobbying, I was able to secure our zone's first National Concours Judges School, which was recently held on a beautiful weekend in Dayton, Ohio.

At the Monterey Parade, Zone 13 Representative James Jacisin and I recognized that there was a need to properly train a new generation of Concours Judges and to make sure that they were trained with both quality and consistency. With the 2015 Parade being held in French Lick, Indiana, James and I felt this was the perfect opportunity for us to work together.

When I sent out the announcement, the response was so outstanding that I had to see if we could significantly increase the number of students. The PCA Concours Chairs and Instructors enthusiastically obliged my request.

A casual and fun Welcome Dinner was arranged at the car themed Quaker Steak and Lube the Friday evening before the event. On Saturday morning, 53 Zone 4 members representing 10 of the 12 regions participated in the school, which was held at the extremely unique and entertaining Taj Ma Garaj, the perfect venue for such an event. The day began with the students receiving an overview of each of the classes Preparation, Preservation, and Restoration as well as an explanation of the categories: Street, Touring, and Full from the highly qualified instructors John Diwik, Rich Laurie, Pat Yanahan, and Hank Weil. Following the introductory presentations, the students proceeded to their individual classrooms for hands on instruction according to the 2015 PCR (Parade Competition Rules) and completed the day with a practice concours using the Parade scoring sheets.



I would like to thank Walter Chin, C. Steven Nelson, and Deniece Chin for all of their hard work and effort in assisting me. I would also like to thank Ms. Vickie Dixon for generously donating the use of this outstanding facility to Zone 4 in order for us to host and conduct this very important National event.

I feel this will be very beneficial to Zone 4 as it will allow us to increase the number of our nationally trained judges within the zone. In addition, these judges will be able to bring their new skill set back to the regions, which will serve to strengthen their region's own concours programs.

The fun and good times are definitely in full swing throughout all of the regions within the Zone. I have already visited many of the regions and have attended over 16 events, including spending time on the track, social gatherings and meetings. I always enjoy having the opportunity to spend time with and interact with PCA members. As I visit each region I am always reminded that for me the PCA motto is so true, it's not just the cars,

Dream Makers Breakfast, Tech Session & Lunch Drive Huge Success!

Dream Makers on the north side of Fort Wayne hosted a very nice breakfast catered by Club Soda along with an Intermediate Shaft (IMS) Bearing Replacement Tech Session on April 11 at their beautiful new facility at 6393 Cross Creek Boulevard. We counted around 65 members and guests in attendance for a very successful first event. The display of cars in the showroom was one of the best — Ferrari's, Lamborghini's, Lotus's and Aston Martins, not to mention many Porsches, including a bright yellow Carrera GT ...and yes, a blue 918!

CIR Membership Chairman, Rick Campodonico offered his 911 Cabriolet for the IMS bearing replacement and Dream Makers' Performance & Service Manager, Nate Corwin gave a thorough presentation on the IMS bearing replacement procedure and important things to listen and look for before trouble starts on certain years of 911's, Caymans and Boxsters. Water cooled Turbos don't have to worry as they have a different engine and Porsche finally did away with the IMS bearing in 2009. It was helpful to have an engine out of the car to show exactly where the bearing is located between the engine and transmission.

After the tech session, many of us took a spirited drive via back roads (along with several Corvettes and a Lamborghini) up to the Oakwood Resort for lunch on Lake Wawasee for a wonderful lunch with great views of Lake Wawasee. Several of us took a tour of one of the resort's deluxe corner room lake view suites after lunch and are seriously thinking about staying there the night before "Porsches to Winona Lake" in Warsaw on July 18. Beautiful elegant facility restored with great care by Porsche owner Dr. Parent of Fort Wayne. If you are ever in the area, be sure to check it out!

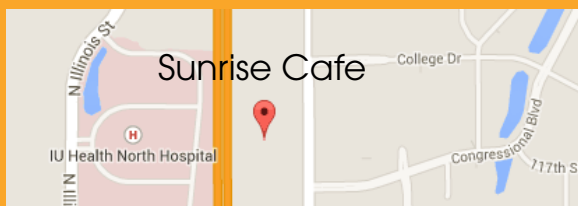

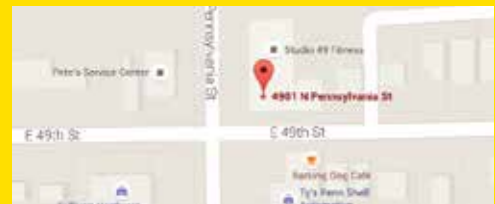

1964 PLATYPUS PORSCHE

The Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca, better known as the Monterey Historics, is an event where you'll see vintage race cars you'll never see anywhere else. For this Midwesterner, it is also an opportunity to see cars that never make it to the Midwest to compete.

My pilgrimage to this mecca of old racecars last August found the case of the oddly named Platypus Porsche, a 1960s sports racer that came out of PAM Foreign Cars of Los Angeles. The owners of the shop included Scooter Patrick, the "P" in PAM, who some old timers will remember raced factory Porsches in the 1960s and later drove a McLaren in the original Can Am series.

The origin of the car was like many sports racers of the 1960s. Have a great little engine – but obsolete or unsuitable car? Build a new car and insert engine! PAM had the engine, a 4 cam, 2 liter Porsche engine. A chassis was then constructed, a chrome-moly space frame under a fiberglass body that was low in the front with a bobbed tail. The builders apparently thought the completed car resembled the Australian Platypus with its duck bill and beaver like tail, hence the name.

The car did well, competing in the under two liter sports car class in Southern California with Miles Gupton driving. It was successful enough that two more of these cars were eventually built and sold.

As often happened with modified race cars of this era, this particular car was continually modified and ended up with a small block V8 Oldsmobile where it competed in the new SCCA USRRC and later the Can Am, before it was retired in 1967.



Since then, the car has been restored to Porsche power, although now with a 2.0 liter 911 6 cylinder engine. With Neil Alexander at the wheel, it is a regular competitor in west coast vintage events, including the Porsche Rennsport Reunion IV at Laguna Seca and of course, the recent Monterey Historics.

What's it like to drive a 2015 Porsche Panamera S Hybrid?

Brigitta and I took her 2000 Boxster S up to Porsche of Fort Wayne in May for some regular maintenance and asked their longtime Porsche Service Advisor, Kent

Schweigel, in advance if we could have a loaner car to use while the work was being done that day. Much to our complete surprise, we were greeted when we pulled into their brand new white Service Reception area with a black metallic 2015 Panamera S Hybrid to use during our visit. Chris Matthews, Porsche Sales Manager came out and went over the basics of the car and told us to "have some fun with it." We felt like Porsche royalty as we silently and very carefully drove out the automatic rollup door!

This four door, four passenger sport sedan with all the creature comforts that anyone could ever desire has the most comfortable ride both of us have ever experienced and we've ridden in long wheel base BMW's, Mercedes Benz and Lexus. The car literally floats over every bump, expansion joint and road deformation as though it didn't exist. It felt like we were in a boat on a quiet lake with a very solid feel and totally

quiet. But press the accelerator and the car took off and handled like a true Porsche in the turns with great exhaust rasp from its V6 engine.

It was interesting watching the navigational screen relay information on the charging of batteries, when the V6 engine was being used or when the electric motors were running exclusively. The car has two gas caps – one for gasoline and another on the other side for plugging into a charger. Porsche of Fort Wayne has two charging stations and the car comes with a charging cord. Brake calipers are green along with the background of the Hybrid badges for a neat detail.

We went everywhere with the car – Two EE's Winery down on US 24 for a bottle of their excellent Plonque' red wine, Sarah's Kitchen for brunch, a blast up I-69 to Dream Makers and back to SweetCars on Porsche Club business and finally Jefferson Pointe for shopping. We even sat in the back seats and imagined we were our best friends! I was impressed with the individual automatic temperature controls for both back and front seat passengers and the luggage space in the trunk! And then came the call from the dealership telling us our Boxster was done and it was all over way too soon!

Final overall impression: The best car imaginable on a long road trip in total luxury and comfort with performance handling and the use of very little gas. If you are worried about Porsche making performance and handling compromises in their new Hybrid models, rest assured the future is looking very bright! Now we want to test drive a new Macan Hybrid! How soon are they going to be available?

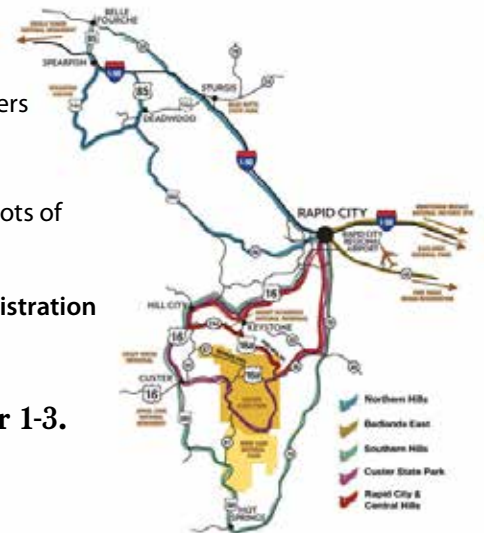
