



ovember fourth saw the local Indianapolis unveiling of the new 911, the type 992. Tom Wood Porsche invited all CIR members along with unaffiliated friends of the dealership, to the gala event. General Manager John Moses welcomed everyone with display of historic 911's lining the curbing in from of the dealership.

The new 992 was introduced in the United States on November 27, 2018 at the Porsche Experience Center in Los Angeles. The base 992 sports a 3.0-liter, twin turbo six, putting out 379 horsepower and 331 lb/ft of torque. It is available in both a coupe and a cabriolet. The 911 pushes that unto 443 horsepower.

The new car is an evolution of the 911, a number of small changes make the 992 an even better car, still a sports car you can drive everyday.

We can't wait to get our hands on the upcoming variants; a Turbo and a GT3 are likely just around the corner.

Here are some reviews on the new 992 —

Car and Driver; No more suspense: our 2020 Porsche

911 Carrera S (992 generation) test car hit 60 mph in 3.0 seconds flat and tripped the quarter-mile lights in 11.3 seconds at 125 mph. Equipped with Porsche's standard eight-speed dual-clutch automatic transmission (a soon-to-be-available sevenspeed manual will be optional), the 911 is capable of launch-control starts that'll leave even the most jaded test driver with the giggles.

Gear Patrol; This, folks, is a Porsche 911.

If ever in the 911's terminally-expanding history a new generation was revealed to be an anything but a vast improvement over the last and a shoo-in for "king of the sports car" crown, I'm convinced the Earth's core might stop spinning and Armageddon would be upon us. It is considered the benchmark for a reason: the Porsche 911 is engineered to be

the best, most archetypal desire-machine available. It is not possible that the Porsche 911 can be anything but a truly remarkable car. So it is written



# FOCUS ON ROB FIKE Article by Larry Clarino

s of this January Rob Fike started his two year term as the new president of the Central Indiana Region of

the Porsche Car Club (CIR). Rob got involved with the club for no other reason than, in 2003, he needed a place to scuff in some race tires and break in a new race motor on his Chevy Corvair. Yes, you read that correctly, a Corvair! For anyone born after 1970 you may need to Google 'Corvair'.

"I had a race coming up and needed a place test and get the car ready. I saw some Porsche club had a couple of track days at Putnam lined-up, so I figured I could run a few laps and get the testing out of the way. After all, I pictured Porsche owners as a bunch of snooty guys, driving expensive cars, with gold chain around their necks. Well, the reception I got was just the opposite," said Rob. "They were warm and welcoming even through I was a real total outsider. Just a bunch of nice people. That got me hooked with the club."

With that experience Rob took notice of the Porsche brand, bought a car and he and wife Judy, became active club members. At the time, he was a pilot and chief of maintenance, with Inland Container, flying and supervising the Indianapolis based fleet of corporate jets. He was flying all over the world as a corporate pilot. That included flying some pretty famous people.

In 2016 the company wanted to move the aviation unit to Austin, Texas. Rob, did not relish the Idea of cowboy-boots and ten-gallon hats so he took his retirement from the flying life.

About that time, he and Judy attended a local seminar on property investment, and the two bought a mobile home park, 'Harrison Grove Estates' in Indianapolis, becoming landlord to 89 mobile home residents. Talk about a career change.

The couple sold the investment for in Rob's words a modest profit, and are now retired. They bought a home in Spencer, Indiana, southwest of Indy.

As the new president of the CIR, his number one rule is to bring more fun in to the club. "We are a diverse group, we have a lot of Cayenne and Macan owners that we need to get involved in the club, but we still need to keep the sports car people interested.

"We are looking to do some drives to maybe restaurants and wineries, Some fun activities where families and kids can become part of the club. A couple of picnics, that sort of thing, but still keep the enthusiast passion in the club."

An immediate change is moving the board of directors meeting to the first Monday night of the month, but adding a video conference capability, so the directors that are a distance from Indy can participate easily and in real time. "The CIR covers a lot of miles. We have members in Fort Wayne that are very active as well as Layette, and south of Bloomington We need to give our members a reason to be members and participate."

The board needs and wants your input and ideas of things you want to do. If you have an idea for a club activity, let the board know and think about serving as an event chair. It is not hard and you will get all the help you need. In fact it can be a very rewarding experience to chair an event and see happy faces of fellow Porsche fans, having fun

Incoming CIR President Rob Fike presented outgoing President Rebecca Pinto with a plaque recognizing her two years of service to the Club. Also, Jim & Laura Legault were presented with an engraved crystal vase, recognizing their contribution over the years as Editors of the CIRcular Newsletter.

After the Awards Ceremonies were completed, Rebecca highlighted the







Club's 2019 philanthropic activities. These included significant donations to four different charitable organizations. Continuing a tradition that began with CruZionsville, \$9000 was donated to *Alzheimer's Association*. \$4500 of that amount came from Carmel Artomobilia through the entry fees collected for Porsche Palooza. CIRPCA matched that amount with an additional \$4500.

\$2850 went to the *Hillcrest Guardian Angels Soldier's Mailing Fund*. Every year since 2004, the Hillcrest Guardian Angels puts together Christmas stockings filled with candy and other goodies and then ships them to Indiana National Guard Soldiers who are deployed overseas as well as local active duty Soldiers.

Speedway Animal Rescue, a group that does amazing work with stray and abandoned animals in Speedway, Indiana, received \$2500. The final donation, \$2500, went to Peyton Manning Children's Hospital. Annually, CIRPCA donates 10% of its bank balance, over and above working capital reserve, to worthwhile Indiana charities vetted by the Philanthropy Committee.

After the Club business was wrapped up, attendees were able to socialize and enjoyed good conversation about the year past and the bright future that 2020 promises.





- 1. Some of this profit may be from the 2018 Fall Pumpkin Run DE, due to when the funds were transferred from ClubReg.
- 2. The GP tickets are always purchased in the previous year, while the revenue is in the current year, 2019; thus the profits this year are slightly overstated.
- 3. The Club matched the donations from our share of the Automobilia/Porschepalooza event in Carmel, and donated a total of \$9000 to Alzheimers Association.
- 4. The Board voted to underwrite the cost of the event by up to \$5000 to encourage attendance in the annual meeting.
- 5. Actual profit for the Pumpkin Run event in 2019.
- 6. To simplify accounting, all minor social events are grouped together. The only social event that lost money was the 2019 Holiday party (\$1560.61 loss).
- 7. \$2500 to the Speedway Animal Rescue Fund and \$2850 to the IN National Guard Christmas mailings, we will also donate \$2500 to Peyton Manning Childrens Hospital in January, 2020.
- 8. PCA expenses, primarily insurance, is assigned to the events (DE's and social events). Due to when we were reimbursed, we only received 3 quarter's funds in 2019 vs. 5 quarters in 2018.
- 9. Revenue: Newsletter ads, investment income (CD's), and donations. Expenses: mini storage rental, CPA and legal filing fees, mailings, website expenses, newsletter expenses, etc.
