The CIR management team would like to welcome new treasurer, Tony Smith and secretary, Russ Bell




on board. A huge thank you to outgoing treasurer Greg Brown and secretary Fred Greulich for serving the club over the last couple of years. We can't tell

Noble, or wherever you get your books.







tefane Ratel's Intercontnental GT Challenge and the Fanatec GT World Challenge made a third visit to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway last October. Designed as a manufacturer's and driver's endurance racing series for GT3 cars, the Intercontinental GT Challenge races are to be held on four different continents this year. Mercedes-AMG has the series lead with wins at the first two races. Bathurst, Australia and Spa Francorchamps, Belgium. The final race will be held in December at the Yas Marina Circuit in the U.A.E. Mercedes domination continued at Indianapolis with another overall win by Team Craft Bamboo Racing of Daniel Morad, Daniel Juncadella and Raffaele Marciello.

Porsche has not figured in the overall results this year and Indianapolis was little different. Two 911 GT3-Rs were entered in the ProAm class, but none in the Pro class. The best Porsche finisher, that of GMG Racing, sporting Ukrainian colors, did achieve a ProAm podium finish of 3rd place with James Sofronas, Kyle Washington and Klaus Bachler at the wheel.

Concurrent to the Intercontinental GT Challenge, the race was also the season ending round for the domestic Fanatec GT World Challenge America. Porsche has been a top competitor in the ProAm class this year with the Wright Motorsports 911 GT3-R leading the season standings. However, the results this weekend were disappointing. While the Pro Class Turner Motorsport BMW M4 of Michael Dinan, Robby Foley and John Edwards took the overall win, the best that the Wright team could

manage was 12th overall and 6th



in ProAm with Jan Helen, Elia Erhart and Charles Luck driving. Unfortunately, their 6th place ProAm finish saw their lead in the class disappear and they ended the season in second place. The GMG Racing Porsche, which only entered two World Challenge races this year, finished 9th overall and 4th in ProAm and finished the season in 13th place.

The weekend also included Touring Car (TC) events and the two final rounds of the GT4 America series with Race #1 on Saturday and Race #2 on Sunday. Here, Porsche's fortunes couldn't have been much better, coming away with two season championship. The RS1 team's Porsche 718 Cayman GT4 RS Clubsport driven by Steven McAleer and Eric Filgueiras finished 2nd on Saturday and was victorious on Sunday, clinching the GT4 Silver Season Championship. The Premier Racing Porsche Cayman finished 3rd in Saturday's round and clinched the GT4 ProAm Season Championship.

HPDE Events with Other PCA Chapters on Different Tracks.

ost PCA members interested in performance driving start with a High-Performance Driving Education (HPDE) event hosted by their local region. In my case that would be the Central Indiana Region (CIR) and our HPDE events at Putnam Park Sportscar Course in Greencastle, Indiana.

After participating in the Pumpkin Run last Fall and Spring Brake this past Spring, I decided I wanted to accelerate my training and explore other tracks. The simplest way to do this is to register for track events with other PCA Regions.

One advantage of living in Northwest Indiana, is that I have several tracks within a few hours' drive. These would include Putnam Park. Gingerman Raceway, Grattan Raceway, Autobahn, Black Hawk Farms Raceway, Waterford Hills Road Racing, and Road America. You do not need to be a member of the region to sign up for their HPDE's. You don't even need to be a PCA member PCA, although often, there is different pricing if you are not. You do not even have to own a Porsche. Many other clubs and private groups also sponsor HPDE's. For instance, I drove at Autobahn with the Windy City BMW chapter. The SCCA offers package deals that include multiple days at multiple tracks.

Most events are two days, and you can sign up for one or both days. If you register as a novice driver you will be assigned an instructor. Most groups

include classroom sessions for novice and intermediate drivers. I know I'm biased, but I think the CIR has the best classroom instruction. Chuck Tucker and Larry Clarino do an amazing job. However, not all events will allow novice drivers so plan accordingly.

Rally Sport Region's, just west of Detroit, classroom is

also very good. They like Chicago Region start with orientation laps to help learn the circuit. Naturally, you will need to have your car inspected before you can enter the track, just

as you do with the CIR events.

Something I noticed while attending the HPDE events this past summer is how inclusive and friendly the PCA regions are. There were always people to help and answer questions. The registration and tech process for each chapter is slightly different. At the Chicago HPDE, you have to torque your own wheels. At the Milwaukee event you are welcome to show up the night before and go through registration, but you can't get your car checked until the morning of the event.

Learning a new track for almost every event can be a little bit daunting. You can download a track map from any of the track websites. At the Gingerman HPDE, the Chicago DE chair had put together an entire book detailing each turn and straight with photos. Running on multiple tracks greatly enhances your driving skills. Autobahn and Gratten both have a lot of elevation changes. Gingerman is hard on your brakes. Road America is much longer and much faster than all of the other tracks listed. I could not tell you which track is the most challenging because each track has its own challenges.

I'm looking forward to trying Mid-Ohio and Road Atlanta next year. I don't think I will be ready for Watkins Glen. No matter which group is sponsoring the event, or which



track you decide to try, register as soon as registration opens. All of the events I have been part of have a limit of participants.

HPDE events are all about learning how to drive your car better and have fun, in a safe environment. Whatever you decide, just get out and drive!

he Indianapolis Motor Speedway Museum has a new exhibit named "SECOND" dedicated to the 43 drivers of the 500 that came in second, but never won the Indianapolis 500 Mile Race.

Why is this so interesting for the Central Indiana Region? Our own CIR member Scott Goodyear is one of those prominently featured in this exhibit.

As some of you may know, in 1992 Scott finished 2nd to Al Unser Jr. by just 0.043 of a second, after starting in

the 33rd and last spot for the 500 Mile Race.

Then again in 1997, Scott finished 2nd to his Treadway Racing teammate, Arie Luyendyk, by just 0.57 of a second.


The '92 Walker Motorsports Mackenzie sponsored Chevy-Lola that Scott Goodyear drove to that record second-place is now owned by Scott and is on display at the IMS Museum.

Of non-winners only Harry Hartz has more 2nd place finishes (1922, 1923, 1926), and only

The museum has done a remarkable job with this exhibit. Several of the second-place cars are on display gathered from all over the world. A special feat as most are on loan from enthusiasts as few if any are owned by IMS. The graphic explaining the displays are second-to-none. (Pardon the pun).

Special FOCUS ON Sammy Dohnert Reggie's Motorworks Intern

eggie Stewart, founder of Reggie's Motorworks in Noblesville is a special kind of guy. One of the principals of his company is giving back to the community that has made Reggie's Motorworks the professionals they are.

As part of that commitment, Reggie brought Sammy Dohnert, a senior at local Noblesville High School, on board as an intern. "I have had an interest in cars for years," said the eighteen-year-old young lady. "It mainly stemmed from both my grandparents. They are both into European cars; we are a European car family. My car is a BMW 328xi, and I get to drive my dad's BMW e46 a lot too."

After graduation this coming May, she wants to pursue her dream of owning an independent automotive shop. "I am looking at Ive Tech Community Collage and Lincoln Tech after high school. Once I found this wormhole of cars I just got hooked. It is now a passion."

Noblesville High school has an internship program for their seniors. Mark Wilkinson, director of the program, said. "We have about 40% of our senior class involved with an internship or cadet teaching. Close to 300 kids are involved with the program. We sit down with each kid, find out what they are interested in and then reach out to the community to find placements."

NHS has the largest intern program in the state, with tremendous support from the City of Noblesville. To say Mark is excited about his job would be a huge

understatement. "It is a carrier pathway experience that we create, and what Reggie is doing with Sammy is exactly that. She has the opportunity to watch and learn, get her hands dirty. This is exactly the model we want to see the kids get exposed to."

Reggie was always interested in helping, but Sammy is the first high school student that really showed interest in such a big way. She has a passion for what Motorworks does. When asked what part of the business she likes most? "Definitely the mechanical work, the technician side. I want to work on the cars. I feel lucky I had the passion in high school and got the chance to work here.

Around my junior year I found I wanted to physically work on cars. So, at the end of my Junior year, I signed myself up for the internship program and they interviewed me. The school worked their butts off to find me the right program and they found Reggie's. Now I come here two or three times a week and hang out, shadowing each of the Motorworks team."

Sammy interviewed with Nick Howard, Reggie's general manager, really just a conversation about cars. Nick said, "She is the real deal. Even at her age she cares about working on cars. She is fun to be around; her enthusiasm is terrific. Everyone here likes having her around."

Reggie Stewart said Sammy gets to take turns working with someone different each day. "She gets to work with all the departments and with each of the techs. We have had three other interns before and that was okay, but Sammy is the perfect fit. She has the desire to learn from everyone



here. She wants to have her own shop, but she wants to wench too and that is great.

We have hired kids that came through tech school and thought that's great, they are ready to work on cars, but that is not true. They are really an apprentice at that point. The best technicians are problem solvers on their own. We have our own apprenticeship program here. We start someone with them doing oil changes, then brake work, moving them up the ladder of complexity."

Sammy is already exploring all phases of the industry. When asked about maybe getting out to Putnam for a CIR HPDE, she had a big smile!

We are fortunate to have people like Reggie Stewart and his whole team. with a passion for the future of the automotive industry. They want and need to train and nurture the level of professionalism needed for the future. And Sammy is just one shining example.


We are sure Rob and Judy will be glad to assist whoever takes over this traditional CIR event. And thank you both for planning all the past excursions.

PCA Sim Racing News January Update 2023



OIL PLUG CRACK

ob Fike is past president of the CIR and a former racer. He does most of his own Porsche maintenance. Here is an experience he had while changing the oil on his 911.

I'd like to share an interesting problem with everyone that occurred to me a few weeks ago.

One of the cars I own is a 1999 Porsche 911/996. I was conducting a routine oil and filter change like I've done many times in the past.

Since the 996's drain plug is aluminum, I normally replace it when the female Allen socket starts getting a little worn. I always use a new crush washer, and a torque wrench for proper tightening. This time was exactly like all the other oil changes right up to when I noticed a drip after I had finished!

Of course, you know I had just filled the engine with ten quarts of brand new, fresh Mobil 1 Synthetic oil. As you



can see in the pictures, the drain plug had cracked. The Allen socket was slightly worn, but not enough for replacement, at least that's what I thought.

So, a trip to the parts store for a new plug and drain all the brand new, fresh Mobil 1 Synthetic oil out of the engine, install the new plug & washer, and refill with another 10 quarts of brand new, fresh Mobil 1 Synthetic oil. Aggravating!!!

From now on I will closely inspect the plug before I reuse it and inspect it again once it's installed and BEFORE adding brand new, fresh Mobil 1 Synthetic oil. This got to be a pricy oil change! I'm thinking the plug probably cracked upon reinstallation when I torqued it to Porsche specs.

Editor's note: Porsche recommends replacing the oil plug and crush washer on every oil change on many Porsche models. Check your owner's manual for your car.

Book Review

Porsche Stories That You Should Know is a book with a title that is exactly everything you need to know about this book, other than you should own it.

The author, Wilfried Müller, as a university student in the '70's, fell in love with motor racing. He credits historic Spa Francorchamps as the circuit that bit him hard with the racing bug. As a youngster he wangled a job as a motor sports reporter

and as they say, the rest is history.

This truly beautiful book is not a history nor a reference book but reads like you are sitting with a couple of guys having beers and telling stories about all things Porsche. Each little story, and that is certainly the best description, is just a few hundred words opposite a wonderfully reproduced photograph pertaining to that little story.

For instance, story number 49, about the Porsche 917/30 Spyder, The Monster.

To quote Müller, "'The Sky is the limit' was the motto here, and Porsche took the organizers at their word...the 917/30 Spyder generated more than 1,200 hp...a maximum speed of 385 km/h." (That's 239 miles per hour.)

Or there is story number 73, Steve McQueen's "Le Mans" From a Flop to a Legend. A wonderful story about a star obsessed with racing and Porsches, illustrated with a great photograph.

If you love Porsches, and if you are reading this you probably do, get this book. Last year the sixth updated edition of 111 Porsche Stories That You Should Know came out. And just a few weeks ago Müller published a new companion compendium; 111 More Porsche Stories That You Should Know.

Both are published by Emons Verlag GmbH and available wherever you get books, including on Amazon Books.




