FOCUS ON Tony Smith

he subject of this CIRcular's Focus is our club's money guy, Tony Smith. And trust me, he keeps us in-line and above-board!

Tony, our current region treasurer certainly has the credentials to be in charge of our club's finances. Tony spent 42 years with Ernst & Young in the firm's audit practice working primarily with manufacturing, retail, and transportation clients.

A native Hoosier, he was born in Columbia City near Fort Wayne. He attended Ball State University and started with the Ernst & Young firm right out of school. "Thou the name changed through several mergers, and is now called EY, it was the only company I've ever worked for," said Tony rather proudly. Tony's last five years with the firm were in San Palo, Brazil where he was charged with setting up a new Capital Market Center for Ernst & Young serving all of South America. "They ask me to set up the office there, for just a two-year tour, two became three, three became five. In my fifth year, my wife Marla said enough was enough. I was then sixty-four and it was time to retire and come home."

In 2019 Tony lost his wife, Marly, to cancer after fifty-one years of marriage to his childhood sweetheart. Tony decided to load Athena, his cat, up in his RV and hit the road for a 10,000-mile journey, he calls their grieving tour. His way of coping with the loss of Marla.

As with all Porsche owners there is a story behind their first Porsche.

"Our first Porsche was actually Marla's, a 1985 944. When our daughter, Deedee was getting ready to head off to college, Marla thought we needed a sports car, so she ended up getting a 944. It was a firecracker, in guards red. We had that for a while, but as life gets in the way we sold it."

After a few years without a sports car, they decided they would look for another Porsche, but it had to be a yellow one. After calling their friend, Betty, in Chicago, who worked in the HR department of a large Porsche dealer on the Southside, and having her check the inventory, they came across a yellow 2000, stick-shift Boxster S. Marla flew to Midway, and drove home in the Boxster!

"After Marla passed, I had the Boxster S, a BMW M5 and a Lexis. My daughter Deedee said we should look at a 911, we are a Porsche family! So, Deedee and I went up to Chicago to see visit Betty and look at what they had in stock, new and used, well they had a brand new '20 red 992 cabriolet, with red wheels. I kept coming back to it, I just thought it was gorgeous. So that

was the one, I said I will take it! Then we sold the yellow Boxster to Betty, our friend, for her personal car."

After joining the PCA in 2021 the first CIR event Tony with now partner, Sandy, participated in was the club's Spring Color Tour. They enjoy touring with the club and have done several. After a bit of arm-twisting Tony was recruited to help with the club finances and run for treasurer. He has brought a new perspective to the board with his auditor background.

The club's current financial direction started under Greg Brown and now led by Tony has our region on the straight and narrow as a proper non-profit 501c (7) social club in the eyes of both the state and federal regulations.

this renowned event. A packed house of CIR members and guests fill the theater with 100% of ticket sales going toward the Cody Unser First Step Foundation. That is Al Unser's daughter's foundation helping people with spinal cord issues.

Cody in 1999, at age 12, was paralyzed from the waist down with Transverse Myelitis. She started the foundation to help folks with quality-of-life matters and to help with awareness of spinal cord diseases. The evening raised more \$3100.00 for her foundation.

The highlight of the evening was Porsche owner and fellow CIR member Scott Goodyear's appearance, not only introducing Al and Tom, but joining them on stage

discussing the historic battle the two had in the 1992 Indy 500, with Goodyear finishing second to Unser in the closest 500 finish ever. That 31-year old record still stands! Many of you will remember that race as it saw the coldest temperature in Indy 500 history.

Everyone was fascinated as the two good friends talked racing and how things have changed through the years.

The Unser family is truly the first name in American motorsports with an amazing

73 Indy 500 starts. The Unser participation spans Al Sr. (27 races), Bobby (19), and Al Jr. (19), as well as Johnny (five), Robby (two) and Jerry (one).

This was the second time the CIR presented the PBS Actor's Studio style format with Tom Beeler just chatting with our guest. Last year, Voice of the 500, Paul Page, kicked off the series. Hopefully this will continue into the future for the Central Indiana Region.

As a side note; The Unser Racing Museum in Albuquerque New Mexico, housing the Unser family history recently announced a merger and a move to the Speedway Motors Museum of American Speed in Lincoln, Nebraska. This will allow a much larger space for the Unser Racing history to be displayed to the public. So, if you find yourself near Lincoln, it will be worth a stop.



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BLACK BRAKE DUST ON YOUR MACAN'S WHEELS?

rigitta and I bought a new Macan S in June of 2021 and really love the car. It is our new trip car and has a great ride due to its air suspension and plenty of acceleration with reasonable gas mileage for long trips. The car is very well thought out with high quality and just about every convenience and safety feature one could want in a sporty SUV. The handling is great, and we love the exhaust sound, especially on start up.

We ordered the car in Sapphire Blue Metallic with full tan leather interior and silver 19-inch sport wheels. It is a very pretty car, and we show it often. Our only complaint outside of the ridiculously small sun visors for us for short people, was the terrible black brake dust on all four wheels rims every time we drove the car. It really shows up on the silver wheels and I got tired of cleaning the wheels every week.

Years ago, I switched out the original equipment Porsche brake pads on our 2000 Boxster S for the same reason with Hawk Performance Ceramic pads, after the OEM pads wore out. I had heard from other Porsche owners that ceramic brake pads were ultra-low dust, and the dust was more of a gray color and didn't show up as much as the carbon black used in most German brake pads.

Pelican Parts offered replacement Hawk Performance ceramic pads for the Boxster. I had SweetCars in Fort Wayne do the switch along with having them repaint our red brake calipers that were starting to peal their clearcoat. What a difference these new ceramic pads made. We show our Boxster, and it has won a couple trophies with the new pads.

Pelican Parts did not offer Hawk Performance ceramic brake pads for any Macan, so we checked with Tire Rack in South Bend. They carried the correct pads for all four wheels. Be sure you get the exact fitment pads for your model of Macan with the correct diameter of brake rotor. Measure your rotors. The pads are different for each model, both front and rear.

Porsche Fort Wayne service did the swap on the Macan. They had no problem doing the work with the understanding that since the pads were not a Porsche part, there would be no warranty.

I have noticed no decrease in stopping distance and I no longer have to clean our wheels weekly. Ceramic Pro coating on the wheels and calipers makes them very slippery, and the gray brake dust does not stick, it washes off easily. Hawk is a well-respected name in racing and makes all kinds of brake pads for many types of applications.

As for the highly inadequate Macan sun visors, I found aftermarket sun visor extenders on Amazon made by TFY that solved all our problems. Macan visors rotate to the side windows, but do not extend and they are way too short for us short people. These fit and blend in perfectly with the existing black visors and nearly disappear.

Kianna, our tour guide, started our walk through the instrument demonstration and trial area. There is one room for electric guitars and another for acoustic. The pianos and keyboards are in a separate room as well as the brass instruments. There is also a room for string instruments including cellos and

violins. Throughout this area you can test any instrument you wish. There are also soundproof booths so you can play without distractions.

Outside the building we visited the Sweetwater Concert Venue. Sweetwater hosts several concerts during the summer for both local and touring artists. The facility includes a music academy that serves high school age musicians during school breaks and the summer vacation seasons.

The kids are organized into "bands" where they are encouraged to arrange song for an album. This includes designing the cover for the album. When the band is ready, they record the songs for the album, and Sweetwater produces it. There's a mosaic of the album covers that have been produced.

The artists have access to any equipment that the facility has in stock. And you never know who will be in the building. Legendary musicians such as Gene Simmons, Eric Johnson, John Petrucci, Victor Wooten, and many others have used Sweetwater Studios.

Book Review

ave you ever read a book that you expected to be good, but it just disappointed you after reading it? *Umbrella Mike: The true Story of the Chicago Gangster Behind the Indy 500*, by Brock Yates is such a book.

Being deeply interested in the history of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and American racing in general as well as having grown up in Chicago, this book sounded extremely interesting, yes, right up my alley. The story of a Chicago gangster, Michael Joseph Boyle, that used ill-gotten gains from his notorious and questionable leadership of the Chicago electrical workers' union to finance his fascination with big time motor racing and winning the Indianapolis 500 Mile Race. With storm clouds of war rising and the convoluted and fascinating story of the acquisition of a few Maserati Grand Prix cars by Boyle, a friend of Al Capone, this book should have been a hit.

Plus, this book was written by a man that was a best-selling author, an executive editor of Car and Driver magazine, and a screenwriter of several hit movies. In other words, a guy that should know how to write well. As a kid I read Car and Driver, cover to cover, and enjoyed Yates' work. So, what happened?


Brock Yates should know better! While the story is fascinating, the saga of pre-war Indianapolis, the story behind the beautiful Maserati 8CTF and the men that raced them for Mike Boyle, Yates jumps around mixing dates and years, repeats the same stories about drivers and race car owners over and over. It becomes a very difficult and confusing book to read.

Many of us grew up reading Brock Yates' featured columns in Car and Driver or watching him with Chris Economaki covering races on TV. He conceived the infamous actual Cannonball Baker Sea-to-Shining-Sea Memorial Trophy Dash, and wrote about it in his best-selling book, *Cannonball*. I highly recommend that one! So that just makes this book more of a disappointment.

Yates does cover the period of Indy racing from 1937 through 1947. That was a time for drivers like Wilber Shaw, Jimmy Snyder, Cliff Burger, Ted Horn, and Rex Mays. A time for owners and builders like Joe Thorne, and Harry Miller. The problem is Brock Yates jumps around so much it is very hard to understand the timeline of this fascinating period in Motorsports.

As the world was heading toward World War II, racing in America was going through huge jumps in performance and changes in the technology of the time. It was a time an extreme danger where drivers took risks almost beyond our comprehension. Super-fast board tracks with monster high banks were springing up all around the nation. Dirt tracks and of course Indianapolis were all part of the lives of these daredevils. A time when motor racing was nearly outlawed by the Congress of the United States.

This is the background of the story Yates set out to tell. I only wish he had organized the story of this fascinating time in a better way.
