Battle on the b

he International Motor Sport Association (IMSA) returned to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway last September with the featured race, a 6-hour endurance run for the WeatherTech Sports Car Championship. They also had races for the Michelin Pilot Challenge, two rounds of the Porsche Carrera Cup and Lamborghini Super Trofeo. Porsche was well represented in the endurance race with four of their 963 Hybrid Prototypes, a GTDPRO 911 GT3 R and three 911 GT3 Rs in the GTD class. The two-hour Michelin Pilot Challenge featured five Porsche 718 GT4 RS CS cars.

GTP

Four Porsche 963s were entered, including two from Porsche Penske Motorsport, and one each from Proton



Competition Mustang Sampling and JDC Miller Motorsports. The fastest 963, from Porsche Penske Motorsport, was out qualified by the Sebastian Bourdais/Renger van der Zande Cadillac and the Louis Deletraz/Jordan Taylor Acura ARX-06. The Penske Porsche of Philipe Nasr/Dane Cameron qualified in 7th, the Proton 963 of Alessio Picariello/Bent Viscaal/Alessio Picariello took 9th and the Phil Hanson/Richard Westbrook/Tijmenvander Helm 963 last in GTP in 10th.

Race day dawned cloudy and soon after the start of the race, the rain came which resulted in a lengthy yellow flag parade before the skies cleared and the real racing resumed. In the end, the BMW M Team of RLL Racing, finished first and second, the first 1-2 finish for this team in two seasons of trying. Initially, the #6 Penske Porsche of Jaminet/Tandy finished 3rd but a post-race inspection demoted them to tenth for having a wiring harness that was outside the rules. Together with a similar penalty for the #40 Acura, this moved the JDC-Miller Porsche to 3rd, the Proton Porsche to 5th and the other 963 of Penske to 7th. Not the best outcome for the Porsche GTP teams, but there was a much better result in the GT classes.

GTDPRO/GTD

Just one Porsche 911 GT3 R was entered in the GTDPRO class, the AO Racing 911 ("Rexie") of Lauren Heinrich and Michael Christensen. After nearly grabbing pole, their time

was disallowed due to a minimum ground clearance violation. Starting last, in 56th position, they tore through the field, up to 4th in the race's rainy first hour. Then, with the final pit stop, they jumped to first, ahead of the Mustang of Mike Rockenfeller/Harry Tincknell and the Lexus of Ben Barnicoat/Jack Hawksworth. It was an amazing comeback that gave the team a comfortable edge in the season championship heading into Petit LeMans.



drove the Wright Motorsport green Porsche.

While the Wright Motorsports GT4 R qualified third out of the four Porsche GTD entries and in 15th place in GTD overall, the team of Jan Heylen, Elliott Sheer and Adam Adelson managed to race to the class lead by lap 54 and then went on to pretty much lead the rest of the race. While this was the team's first victory of the season in IMSA, their strength was showcased again weeks later by coming within two tenths of a second of winning the Intercontinental GT Challenge at the Indianapolis Speedway's 8 Hour race.

Michelin Pilot Challenge

The weekend started brightly for the RS1 Porsche 718 GT4 RS CS Team with a pole. One of five Porsches entered, drivers Trent Hindman/Steve McAleer, led early before a pit lane bobble where the car was let down from its air jacks before a right rear tire was tightened. In the end, the team finished in 9th, one place below the highest finishing Porsche and that of the Matt McCarthy/Riley Dickenson KellyMoss with Riley entry. The remaining three Porsches were out of the top placings.



Porsche Carrera Cup

Loek Hartog swept both Cup races with flag-to-flag victories in his KellyMoss GT3. Indy Region's own Dan Clarke finished 3rd in Race 2 on Saturday, while Alex Sedgwick finished 2nd. Hartog's victories brought him closer to the 2025 Pro Championship with four more rounds to go at Petit Le Mans and Circuit of the Americas.



It was a great weekend of racing, with CIR Meet & Greets and tours of the Penske Porsche garage, fan walks through pit lane before the races and nine hours and 20 minutes of some of the best sports car racing in the country.

The Rest of the Story...


Season championships were determined three weeks after Indy, at Petit LeMans at Road Atlanta. While the Ganassi Cadillac GTP team won the race, Penske Porsches finished 2nd and 3rd, with the #7 of Matt Campbell, Felipe Nasr/Dane Cameron taking the season championship. In GTDPRO, AO Racing's Julian Andlauer/ Laurin Henrich/Michael Christensen finished five laps off the lead but had accumulated enough points to win the season championship. In GTD, Indy's Eric Bachelart's Conquest Ferrari won the race but Winward Racing Mercedes won the championship.

Loek Hartog wrapped up the Porsche Carrera Cup title in the Pro class, finishing 2nd in the two races this weekend. The KellyMoss with 718 GT4 RS won the Michelin Pilot Race but the Matt Plumb/Pete Holton Aston Martin took the season championship.

uftgekühlt, which means air-cooled in German, is a distinctive car show celebrating air-cooled Porsche models, from the early 356 to the iconic 911 and 914 series. Luftgekuhlt; The Porche Car Show, was co-founded by Patrick Long, a former Porsche factory racing driver, and creative professional Howie Idelson in 2014. Luftgekühlt started as an intimate gathering for Porsche enthusiasts and has grown into a

global cultural phenomenon that highlights these unique vehicles in curated, visually stunning settings.

Unlike traditional car shows, Luftgekühlt focused on blending art and design. The first event was held in a lumber yard in Venice, California, and it immediately stood out for its laid-back, artistic vibe and its ability to attract not only car enthusiasts but also art and design fans.

For the inaugural event, Long and Idelson envisioned a gathering that transcended the traditional car show format, blending art, culture, and automotive passion.

Over the years, the event has expanded globally, holding


editions in cities like Indianapolis, San Francisco, Copenhagen, and locations across Europe. Each show emphasizes storytelling, spotlighting both the cars and their owner's personal histories.

Jeff Zwart plays a significant role in Luftgekühlt as a central figure in its creative and cultural development. Zwart, a renowned photographer, filmmaker, and race car

driver, is deeply embedded in Porsche culture and has a long history with the brand. His work behind the camera. as well as his competitive driving, has made him a legendary figure within the Porsche community.

Luftgekühlt draws a diverse audience of Porsche enthusiasts, collectors, designers, photographers, and motorsport fans. The appeal lies in its unique blend of meticulously restored classics, rare racing models, and subtly customized cars. all displayed in artistically



Porsche fans, while others are newcomers captivated by the brand's legacy and the show's aesthetic charm.

The milestone 10th edition, held on October 5, 2024, returned to Universal Studios-Hollywood in Los Angeles. This venue provided cinematic backdrops like New York City streets, historic European alleys, and Western sets enhancing the display's visual impact. Around 400 cars were featured, including a mix of iconic models such as the Vasek Polak Racing 934, a Martini Racing 917 Kurzheck, and a color wheel of rare 964 RS models. The event also celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Porsche 911 Turbo (Type 930) with dedicated exhibits.

Displays were intentionally spaced out to create immersive scenes, fostering interaction and conversation among attendees. Highlights included both factory-restored cars and unique owner-modified vehicles, emphasizing Luftgekühlt's commitment to diversity within the air-cooled Porsche community.

What sets Luftgekühlt apart is its artistic structure under



the watchful eye of Creative Director Jeff Zwart. Unlike traditional car shows that focus solely on the vehicles, Luft emphasizes presentation, often integrating the cars into themed environments. This approach has turned the event into a cultural touchstone for the automotive world. Patrick Long describes it as an effort to, "Tell an allencompassing story of air-cooled cars."

very organization like the Central Indiana Region (CIR) has a coterie of members that are the glue that holds the circle together. In the case of our region, the heart of our group is Bob and Brigitta Snider. And they are definitely a team with Bob now holding the official title of Club Historian.

While not a charter member of the CIR, Bob did join the PCA in 1978, forty-seven years ago when he was a founding member of the new Ramme Region in the Muncie, Indiana area.

"Ramme means pile-driver in German. We named our region that because that is how we drove on the streets around here", said Bob with a smile. "There was a group of us mostly bachelors but a few couples too, that would meet at the old Cork & Cleaver restaurant in Muncie. We all had Porsches and loved to drive them fast. Well, I was traveling in Florida with my new '77, 924 getting an oil change at the Sun Coast Porsche dealership and they told me there was a Porsche club, the PCA. So, when I got back here I contacted PCA national, and they said we should start a new region. We did! We got our official PCA charter in 1979. Then in '86 the Ramme Region finally merged with the CIR."

Bob and Brigitta actually met in junior high school. "I would escort her home on my bicycle." The two went their separate ways after high school as Bob went to Notre Dame and Brigitta went to Ball State. Then in 1998 they got back together. "I made her my PCA co-member," said Bob. Now that was a commitment! The couple got married in 2006, Bob's first, Brigitta's second marriage.

They now have a 2000 Boxster S that Brigitta picked out just for Bob, as they visited the old Ooley & Blackburn Imports showroom in Carmel. "I said to Bob that little maroon convertible is just right for you, and we should buy it." Bob did not argue.

They also have a 2021 sapphire blue metallic, Macan S that is sort of the traveling car, and the Boxster more of the fun car as they love to travel. One of their passions is organizing road trips for the CIR and attending Porsche events around the nation. Bob has taken part in more than twenty Porsche Parades and several Treffens.

Bob had somewhat of an odd start to his Porsche owner experience. His first was a 1973 914 he picked up in Germany with a plan to tour Europe for a while, but the car was stolen in Rome. Then his second, a '74, 914 2-liter, was totaled in 1977, but he did stick with the brand getting a 1977 924.

Bob has served the CIR as an at-large board member for several terms and has been both president and secretary at different times. "The thing I am most proud of is the years I was membership chairman. They were just fun, maybe because you get good feedback on how you are doing. 
Guy.' "I got just the place to help y'all. And it's only about sixty miles," he said with a toothless grin.



PERFORMANCE DRIVER EDUCATIO

n October 2020, I attended my first CIR HPDE (track day) and wrote an article about my experience, in the January 2021 Circular. Now four years later, I wanted to share what I've learned with our clubs HPDE events as well as some hosted by other groups.

After a number of HPDEs, I've had the opportunity to work with several instructors. Lisa (poor Lisa!) helped me along my first two HPDEs. She deserves a medal for not giving up on me, but finally, I started to feel as if I belonged on a track.

On a later weekend, I came face to face with another fear, RAIN. My instructor that weekend was Kevin. Kevin was so excited for the rain, while I, on the other hand, was secretly wishing I was anywhere but there. Fear was present, but when our run groups' turn came, out we went. No time for nerves. It was time to listen to my instructor. To my amazement, running in the rain was fun. I ended the day totally pumped, something I never thought I'd say. When the weekend was over, I again realized just how important the instructors are, and how they make things possible, safe and fun.

Then my third year at CIR's Spring Brake, I was lucky enough to have an instructor named Kelly, an experienced racer and instructor, at both the amateur and pro level. He pushed me right from the start. I loved every minute of it. He expected more of me, and I wanted to deliver. Between sessions, he drilled me on car control while sitting in the paddock. Track sessions, intense at times, were exactly what I needed. I learned so much about braking and car control. With his help, I moved up to group C and was allowed to solo. That was my goal. track days with another group. This was a fundraiser for the ACD museum in Auburn. I planned to run a day at Mid-Ohio and a day at Putnam Park. With their own format, it was totally different than what we do with CIR-PCA. One day

events, with an open track all day, no run groups, no instructors. Initially, it sounded scary, but track rules much like we have in our club. No passing without point-bys keeps everyone safe, but being on the track with Ferraris.

McLarens and other high horsepower cars makes situational awareness an even bigger necessity. For Mid-Ohio, I watched videos and downloaded maps to familiarize myself with the track. However, I really did not feel comfortable with the layout. I did some lead/follow and that was good, but on my own, I was lost.

I knew track etiquette, and didn't get in the way, but I was not having a great time. Heavy thunderstorms blew in and the track was closed early. Hallelujah! I survived the day; happy knowing Putnam Park was our next track.

A month later found me at Putnam, where I was much more comfortable. I was having a good time but met up with friends from a different car club, who were given a free track day from their brand sponsors. These guys had been on a racetrack, and were now in the midst of track veterans, and having a generally lousy time. I told them

Stepping outside my comfort zone, I signed up for two

to wait until the high-powered cars came to the pits, and then follow me.

Instead of following me, they pulled onto the track ahead of me. They were not hitting the apexs, nor braking properly. On the second lap, one went off into the grass, no harm, but embarrassment for sure. Totally overwhelmed with the whole experience, they decided to leave. I can only imagine what I would have thought had I been in their shoes. Regardless, I stayed until closing and had the best time, realizing the value of the CIR-PCA instructor program that taught me proper performance driving.

This year, 2024, with another different sponsoring group, I decided to try Gingerman Raceway in Southern Michigan. I heard it was a nice track, not too technical but a bit more challenging than Putnam. This organization has run groups,




self-assigned by the drivers. I arrived in 94-degree weather to a track I had never seen. I had a bit of a car issue. It had me unsettled, and in my haste, did not adjust my tire pressures. It was a handful, as my tire pressures were sky high. I had my first spin in a slight downhill turn and realized I needed someone, an instructor to show me the fast and safest. way around. I completed my last session with no drama but left rather humbled. What I've learned from running with these other groups, is the value of CIR-PCA's program. It really is a great way to give drivers a chance to learn to drive on a track safely and with confidence. Having the instructors can be priceless. I would encourage anyone interested in performance driving to go with a PCA event first, it's the safest and fun way to get indoctrinated to track driving. I have much respect for all the instructors as they give their time to teach newbies like me to be safe and at the same time have a fun experience. The CIR-PCA classroom sessions add much to the day, with the sharing of knowledge and experiences. It really is a complete package.

As I turn 70 in a few months and am having to adjust to the realities of age, I know I can do this. My Porsche 986 Boxster has not suffered at all. My only expense was a new set of tires, now with eight track days on them. A few dollars spent getting the required technical inspections done before PCA events also gives me confidence in the condition of my car as well as the others on the track.

As a lifelong racing fan, the HPDEs have enhanced my appreciation of the skills it takes to drive at speed, as well as greater appreciation of track conditions. And, I've noticed I no longer am inclined to operate my cars at speeds on public roads in search of vehicle limits, having researched these limits in the safe environment we have within the HPDE framework.

Thank you to all the people that make these events possible, and also to my friend Greg Smith, who encouraged me to commit to my first HPDE weekend. I've had a great time and am already looking forward to Spring Brake 2025!

On November 9, 2024, fourteen CIRs joined up with club member, Eckhard Groll, for our second visit to the Purdue Engineering labs on the West Lafayette campus. Dr. Groll is the Director of the Office of Professional Programs, Head of Mechanical Engineering, and Reilly Professor of Mechanical Engineering.

Our first stop of the day was with Professor Ajay Malshe at the Manufacturing & Materials Research Lab (MMRL). The purpose of the MMRL is to bring people with different backgrounds together to search for new ways of manufacturing pretty much everything. An example would be an engine block. Instead of taking a billet of say, aluminum and machining out everything that does not look like an engine, you build it out of aluminum powder. Instead of taking away metal, you are adding it. Like 3D printing. This creates much less waste and the ability to make changes faster. We saw examples of parts being made and the machines that do it. A true glimpse into the future.

Next stop was Purdue Motorsports. Here engineering students work with professional race teams on intercollegiate motorsports competitions. Purdue students participate in Go-Karts, Baja SAE, Formula SAE, Electric and Solar Racing, and Autonomous Vehicle Motorsports. Groll has been working with professional race teams to share knowledge with the students and prepare them for a transportation career be it with a racing team or in the automotive industry.

Dr. Groll then led a tour of the new Seng Liang Wang Hall complex that is part of the Hayes Triangle. The new Hall is named after the father of Electrical Engineering and Purdue alumnus Patrick Wang. Hard hats and construction vests were the fashion for the visit making us really stand out! After the tour, we all headed over to Nine Irish Brothers for some Bangers & Mash or Shepherd's Pie for lunch, and of course, good fun.




Porsches of every make were on display.

PCA Sim Racing 2025 Plans — Dec. 2024

Tirst, a look back.

It was late in 2018, that Doug Atkinson had talked to a fellow Lone Star Region member about sim racing and how PCA members could enjoy it. He was told that PCA drivers were already using sim racing to learn tracks, especially Circuit of The Americas (CoTA) in Austin.

Doug contacted PCA Executive Director Vu Nguyen about the feasibility of a national program for PCA sim racers. Vu assigned recently hired PCA Marketing Director Jim Hemig to "see if it might be worth pursuing". Jim was convinced it could be a good activity for PCA members. Jim provided a surprising bit of information: the Peachstate Region had already started doing sim racing among drivers in their region under the guiding hand of longtime Peachstate member, Andrew Ellsom.

Andrew, Jim, and Doug talked on the phone about some ideas for a national sim racing activity where the concept was fleshed out. Then Mike Nyden and William Yu joined in and the original PCA Sim Racing Steering Committee was formed, which has expanded and continues to this day.

In February 2019, Doug presented the idea at the Winter National Staff Meeting to the Zone Representatives and the PCA Executive Committee (EC). The proposal was accepted and PCA Sim Racing was off and away! A Mission Statement was then drafted which set the stage for the program's culture we all now live by and appreciate...

PCA Sim Racing provides a quality sim racing experience, including opportunities for all levels of driving experience, competitive intensity, and sim racing interests, in a friendly environment for all Porsche Club of America members.

The experiment worked!

Though the PCA Executive Committee (EC) agreed to respond to member interest initially by supporting a sim racing program, it was considered a bit of an experiment. We are most pleased to report that the program has now shown its value and the PCA Executive Committee considers it now a regular part of the array of activities it supports for the membership.

However, with our new status comes the need to remove the training wheels concerning our expenses. As PCA members, you're aware that the majority of PCA activities and events you participate in all carry fees. This is because PCA programs are expected to be as self-funding as possible. Having graduated from the incubator, we now have the same expectations for 2025.

Providing a great experience yet balancing our budget.

By now you can see where this is going — the time has come for us to begin generating some revenue to assist in balancing our budget and enabling us to provide all the services and features we know you want. We have worked on this for nearly a year now: We have surveyed you the drivers, and surveyed the fees for the various paid leagues that offer broadcasts and live race control on iRacing to make sure that we have a solution that works for all stakeholders.

We are therefore excited to announce our new PCA Sim Racing Grid Pass program! This new program is optional and will have an annual fee of \$48. The Grid Pass entitles the holder to participate in Series 13, Series 14, and the Team Racing Series, which will have race control and broadcasts of every race! All other PCA Sim Racing activities continue at no cost to participants who do not opt-in for the Grid Pass program.

In terms of getting closer to balancing our budget, there's more to it though. There are two potential sources of revenue to help cover our expenses: our program fees, which is exactly what the new Grid Pass is, and external sponsorships.

We have periodically had external title sponsorships, but haven't had one for quite a while now. As you can imagine this is not something we can ever count on, but know that we are actively working behind the scenes on external sponsorship as well.

The bottom line is that between our Grid Pass program, external sponsorship from time to time, and PCA covering the rest, the PCA Sim Racing program's growth will be on solid financial footing.


he new book by Art Garner, *A.J. Foyt Survivor Champion Legend* is simply the life story of the greatest racing driver of all time. That is a whopper of a statement but after reading this book you will simply understand what I mean.

Garner, a great writer and a consummate researcher, goes into detail of nearly every race Foyt drove. Not just as the first four-time winner of the Indianapolis 500, and his unmatched record of Indy car wins, but his NASCAR and USAC stock car, sports car, midget, and sprint car races all in order by year. The highs and lows of A.J.'s and the entire Foyt family's lives in Texas, including the wins, the losses, the crashes, everything is included.

To anyone that saw him race or even knows of him, and that is pretty much everyone, motorsport fan or not, A.J. is bigger than life. Art Garner found this to be true, as this is only volume-one of the Foyt life story. That covers A.J. growing up in Texas through his fourth Indy 500 win in 1977. Volume-two due in May of 2026, will cover 1978, A.J.'s driving, his retirement from the wheel to his current life as a race team owner, wine lover, entrepreneur, dad and grandpa.

"I did not plan on writing this. I went to Texas to do an interview with Foyt around 2019. We sat down and that short-planned interview just grew into doing this book," said Garner as we spoke on the phone. "I love the research. I looked at thousands of newspaper stories from around the world. I interviewed more than a hundred people, drivers, the Hulman family members, mechanics, car owners. Everyone from Dan Gurney to Tony George for this book."

I can guarantee you will learn things about A.J. and racing you did not know by reading this 600-plus page tome that reads like a novel. Foyt's hard-earned reputation as a tough, dukes-up ready to fight, taskmaster, as a driver and owner, is contrasted with the

caring generous, compassionate, kindhearted side of Foyt. This is a side seldom seen in public, but always there.

A.J.Foyt Survivor Champion Legend is also about a time when there was a much darker side to racing. A side we often like to forget when death was right around the next turn. Yes, '50s, '60s, '70s when drivers/mechanics/fans around the world would die nearly every week. I know this is hard to believe for you younger fans but there was a time when racing was truly dangerous. To survive took unqualified skill, bravery, and frankly a lot of luck.

Art Garner's *Black Noon: The Year They Stopped the Indy 500* may have set the standard for stories of racing. *A.J.Foyt Survivor Champion Legend* continues Garner's legacy. This is a must read.
